

From the Pastor's Desk

If we are totally honest with ourselves, then this gospel will bother us some – perhaps even a lot. "It isn't fair" we might say. The fact of the matter is that God's view of justice and fairness is often much different than our view. The parable tells us that our heavenly reward is not something we earn but rather is a free gift. God has made His rewards available to all through faith in Christ Jesus. In fact, what we really deserve for our sins is death. This parable should cause us to be immensely grateful for at last two things: First, for God's ridiculous generosity towards us. As long as we have the breath of life in us, it is never too late to go to work for God. And second, we can be thankful that God does not deal with us according to our own notion of justice and fairness. If he did, we would have a terrible fate.

Saint of the Week: St. Pio of Pietrelcina

Feast day: Sept 23rd Birth: May 25, 1887,

Death: September 23, 1968, Canonized: June 16, 2002



Francesco Forgione was born on May 25, 1887, in Pietrelcina, Italy. He stated that by the time he was five years old, he had already made the decision to dedicate his entire life to God. His parents were peasant farmers. He worked on the land up to the age of 10, looking after the small flock of sheep the family owned. His family was deeply religious and they attended Mass daily, prayed the Rosary nightly, and abstained from meat three days a week in honor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Although Francesco's parents and grandparents were illiterate, they narrated Bible stories to their children. Francesco was afflicted with a number of illnesses from a young age. At six he suffered from severe gastroenteritis. At ten he caught typhoid fever.

As a youth, Francesco reported that he had experienced heavenly visions and ecstasies. In 1897, after he had completed three years at the public school, Francesco was said to have been drawn to the life of a friar. When Francesco expressed his desire to his parents, they made a trip to Morcone to find out if their son was eligible to enter the Order. The friars there informed them that they were interested in accepting Francesco but that he needed to be better educated. Francesco's father went to the United States in search of work to pay for private tutoring for his son. At age 15, he entered the novitiate of the Capuchin friars at Morcone and took the name Pio in honor of St. Pius I . He was ordained a priest in 1910 and was drafted during World War I. After he was discovered to have tuberculosis, he was discharged. In 1917, he was assigned to the San Giovanni Rotondo friary.

On September 20, 1918, as he was making his thanksgiving after Mass, Padre Pio had a vision of Jesus. When the vision ended, he had the stigmata in his hands, feet, and side. Life became more complicated after that. Medical doctors, Church authorities, and curiosity seekers came to see Padre Pio. In 1924, and again in 1931, the authenticity of the stigmata was questioned; Padre Pio was not permitted to celebrate Mass publicly or to hear confessions. He did not complain of these decisions, which were soon reversed. Padre Pio rarely left the friary after he received the stigmata, but busloads of people soon began coming to see him. In time his confessional ministry would take 10 hours a day; penitents had to take a number so that the situation could be handled. Many of them said that Padre Pio knew details of their lives that they had never mentioned. A number of people have reported cures they believe were received through the intercession of Padre Pio. Those who assisted at his Masses came away edified; several curiosity seekers were deeply moved. Like Saint Francis, Padre Pio sometimes had his habit torn or cut by souvenir hunters. He died on September 23, 1968.
