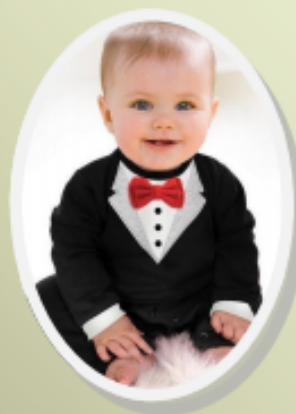

"Blessed be
the Name
of the Lord"
~ Job 1:21

In the month dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, below is a portion of the Catechism of the Catholic Church expounding on the meaning of the 2nd commandment. (*Numbers refer to paragraphs in the CCC.)

ARTICLE 2

THE SECOND COMMANDMENT

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

* I. THE NAME OF THE LORD IS HOLY

2142 The second commandment prescribes respect for the Lord's name. Like the first commandment, it belongs to the virtue of religion and more particularly it governs our use of speech in sacred matters.

2143 Among all the words of Revelation, there is one which is unique: the revealed name of God. God confides his name to those who believe in him; he reveals himself to them in his personal mystery. The gift of a name belongs to the order of trust and intimacy. "The Lord's name is holy." For this reason man must not abuse it. He must keep it in mind in silent, loving adoration. He will not introduce it into his own speech except to bless, praise, and glorify it.

2144 Respect for his name is an expression of the respect owed to the mystery of God himself and to the whole sacred reality it evokes. The sense of the sacred is part of the virtue of religion:

2145 The faithful should bear witness to the Lord's name by confessing the faith without giving way to fear. Preaching and catechizing should be permeated with adoration and respect for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

2146 The second commandment forbids the abuse of God's name, i.e., every improper use of the names of God, Jesus Christ, but also of the Virgin Mary and all the saints.

2147 Promises made to others in God's name engage the divine honor, fidelity, truthfulness, and authority. They must be respected in justice. To be unfaithful to them is to misuse God's name and in some way to make God out to be a liar.

2148 Blasphemy is directly opposed to the second commandment. It consists in uttering against God - inwardly or outwardly - words of hatred, reproach, or defiance; in speaking ill of God; in failing in respect toward him in one's speech; in misusing God's name. St. James condemns those "who blaspheme that honorable name [of Jesus] by which you are called." The prohibition of blasphemy extends to language against Christ's Church, the saints, and sacred things.

North Dakota March for Life, January 29

A group of dedicated pro-life people and organizations have come together to organize a powerful pro-life event at the ND state capital on Friday, January 29 for all those unable to travel to Washington, D.C. to participate in the national March for Life.

11:00 AM—Mass at the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit with celebrant Bishop David Kagan, immediately followed by march (or drive) to the state capitol (other Bismarck parishes/high schools are having Mass at their own parish; but the Cathedral Mass is open to the general public.)

12:30 PM to 1:00 PM—Rally with program at the capitol steps

The North Dakota March for Life will take place at the state capitol in Bismarck. The centerpiece of the rally will be a moment of silence in recognition of the 62 million lives lost to abortion. 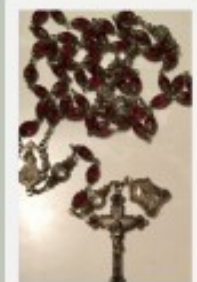

Phishing email WARNING!

Once again, in recent weeks, several parishioners and office/school staff have received fraudulent attempts via email to share personal information or to follow directives from "Rev. Russell Kovash" to extend assistance to third parties. These are phishing (word coined as an analog with the sport of angling) attempts by scammers using e-mail lures, setting out hooks to "fish" for passwords, financial data, or direct assistance from the "sea" of internet users. There are four components to look out for in a phishing email scheme:

Generic greeting. In our local scenario, the scam is simply a greeting from someone pretending to be Father Kovash. Understand that your email addresses are readily accessible from public databases so how they got yours should not be surprising.

Forged link or Fake e-mail address. Even if a link has a name you recognize somewhere in it, it doesn't mean it originates from or points to the real person or the actual organization such as a bank or government agency. Roll your mouse over the link and see if it matches what appears in the email. If there is a discrepancy, don't click on the link. Also, websites where it is safe to enter personal information begin with "https" – the "s" stands for secure (with some browsers, a padlock icon  may take the place of the "https"). If you don't see these before the link, do not proceed.

Requests personal information. The point of sending phishing email is to trick you into providing private information. If you receive an email requesting personal information – or a note to "email me as soon as you get this message" – be on the alert that it might be a phishing attempt. If you know the person sending the email, call or text them to confirm the validity of the message.

Sense of urgency. Internet criminals want you to provide your personal information now. They do this by making you think something has happened that requires you to act fast. The faster they get your information, or to get you to comply with instructions, the faster they can move on to another victim.

In the reported instances where Fr. Kovash's identity was hijacked to phish, the originating emails were variations of his name and title. Anyone can create a fake email account such as kovashrevrussell@gmail.com or frkovashbismarcknd@gmail.com or any such combination simply by getting the relevant data from the parish or diocesan website. Coupled with a personal greeting, these hooks allow cybercriminals to get their target victims to reply and comply.

DO NOT readily reply without examining the email address from which the inquiry or greeting is coming from. Keep in mind that companies, agencies, and people can be impersonated online.

If in doubt, contact the pastor directly, or confirm the requests with the Parish Office if you're not able to reach him. Father Kovash will never place a direct, targeted petition via email.
