Were you aware that St. Joseph's Catholic Elementary School offers pre-school education? We proudly serve students that are 3 and 4 years of age in our pre-school program with a variety of options available! One of our pre-school teachers is CDA (Child Development Associate credential) and our other pre-school teacher is completing her certificate. Students must be at least age 3 by July 31, 2021 to qualify for enrollment. St. Joseph's pre-school little tots program focuses on social-emotional skills, pre-reading, writing, and math skills, as well as forming their relationship with Jesus. The students in Full-Day focus on learning through play in the morning and the afternoon is a focus of rest and free-time. All pre-school options implement Creative Curriculum which emphasis learning through play. Please call us for more information on pre-school options and how to get your students enrolled for the fall school year.

Enrollment applications for the 2021-2022 school year are still being accepted for families currently enrolled as well as new families. There will be some Tuition Assistance available for families that are needing assistance in paying tuition. LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR CATHOLICS

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.

FASTING IS OBSERVED on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

BY THE THREEFOLD DISCIPLINE of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during the season of Lent, all Catholics are called to embrace penances and to perform works of charity that reflect a deep desire for conversion of heart. They are also called to pray fervently for those Catechumens and Candidates who will celebrate the Easter Sacraments with the Church this year. May this Lent lead all to a deeper union in Christ with one another.
