**Our good Bishop Kagan is reestablishing the Sunday/Holy Day obligation to attend Mass as of the First Sunday of Lent, the weekend of February 20-21, 2021. Please see below for additional changes regarding liturgies beginning on that weekend also.**

### Changes

1. Spacing in Church is eliminated
2. Funeral Vigils and Visitations before Mass may be in the Church at the Pastor's discretion.
3. Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist at the Pastor's discretion may resume for Parish Masses only.
4. Mass Servers at the discretion of the Pastor and with the permission of parents may resume.
5. Choirs for Parish Masses may resume with the usual numbers.
6. Holy Water may be put into the fonts in the Church.
7. Penance Services are allowed but only with the use of screens

### No Change

1. Holy Communion under the one species of the Consecrated Host.
2. The Sign of Peace remains suspended.
3. No Offertory procession with the gifts.
4. No face-to-face Confessions.

### **Marriage Annulments:**

#### **Declarations of Nullity of Marriage**

The Tribunal of the Diocese of Bismarck is staffed by persons who have been appointed by the Bishop of Bismarck and who have received special training to represent him and the faith community in church judicial proceedings for marriage cases and other matters of Church law. Most of its work involves assisting divorced persons who are interested in proving the nullity of a prior marriage bond, allowing them to remarry in the Church. As such, the Tribunal has a three-fold ministry:

- Protecting the integrity and indissolubility of marriage as Christ taught;
- Assisting in the exercise of rights given in Church law for those who are seeking a possible remarriage in the Catholic Church; and
- Helping participants experience reconciliation with their faith community insofar as possible.

## **Lenten Discipline Ideas**

*(Ash Wednesday is Feb 17)*

*Remember: Be simple; don't take on too much. Do what you for sure can commit to. Narrow down one or two things you'd like to take on or give up this Lent. It may be something not listed below! If you have a family, take some time with your kids to ponder what each of you will do this Lent!*

### **For Adults (most applicable to high school students also)**

1. Give up electronics (tablets, videogames, TV) all of Lent or one day each week
2. Avoid checking your phone every two minutes
3. Sign up for a weekly Adoration hour or make a visit to the Church once a week.
4. Be positive, don't complain, and see the best in others and situations
5. Don't gossip
6. Give up sugary drinks or dessert and give the money you save to a charity
7. Read the Scripture readings before Mass to help you enter into Mass more deeply.
8. Write a letter to or call a relative you haven't seen in a while
9. Give up not wanting to go to confession
10. Call/write a letter to someone at the nursing home
11. Pray the rosary, or at least a decade a day
12. Go to Mass during the week (in addition to Sunday) or Stations of the Cross once a week
13. Give up alcohol
14. Give up swearing
15. Sign up for Dynamic Catholic's *Best Lent Ever* email reflections found at [dynamiccatholic.com](http://dynamiccatholic.com)
16. Volunteer at a community charitable event
17. If you don't have a crucifix in your home, buy one and put it in a prominent place
18. Give up wearing makeup
19. Give up unforgiveness
20. Fight hard to root out porn; sign up for [covenanteyes.com](http://covenanteyes.com)
21. Make a "sacred space" in your home. Place a bible, candle, rosary, holy water, etc., on a small table and pray by it a few minutes each day.
22. Don't listen to music while driving; embrace silent moments
23. Declutter your home and give things away
24. Bring a journal to Mass and take notes during the homily to meditate on during the week
25. Make someone's day and write them a kind, encouraging note

### **For Kids**

1. Avoid asking for toys when going to the store with mom or dad
2. Do a child-friendly chore that you don't like to do, setting the table, doing dishes, etc
3. Learn a new prayer and memorize it
4. Give up recess to volunteer at school
