

#### From the Principal's Desk (By Mrs. Julie Quamme)

There are only 4 weeks of school remaining for this year! Our students and staff have been face-to-face learning all year! While this school year has been noticeably different, we are excited to get back to some normal-cy. Beginning Monday, May 3 the temperature checks will be eliminated at the school door in the morning and children will no longer need masks to enter the school. The gym door will also open at 7:45 a.m. Students will eat breakfast in the gym instead of classrooms and will be dismissed to their room at 8:10. Pre-school students will be dropped off at 8:10 and parents will be allowed to bring their student to the classroom.

**Enrollment applications for the 2021-2022 school year** are still being accepted for families currently enrolled as well as new families. The individual will be expected to teach, advocate, encourage, counsel, and witness in keeping with the beliefs and practices of the Catholic faith and teachings, Some of the duties include, but are not limited to, attending weekly Mass with the students, teaching Religion class, planning Mass and prayer services. Teachers are required to create a Christian, positive educational climate for students to learn and grow in.

Other duties will include planning, preparing and delivering instructional activities using school adopted and/or approved curriculum resources, integrating grade appropriate goals and objectives, grading assignments, administering tests to monitor students' progress, and maintaining grades on RenWeb. Together we work as a team to ensure student goals are being met. Additional assignments may include, but not limited to, recess duty, dismissal duty, and lunchroom monitoring.


