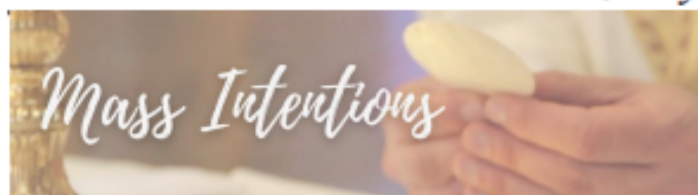

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel Jesus is asked, what is the greatest commandment? Jesus responds by reciting the Sh'ema, which all good Jews knew by heart, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." But then Jesus adds something new when he says the second is like it, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Why does Jesus add this? Bishop Robert Barron in a reflection on this passage says that "if we truly love God, then we will love everyone God loves, even those who are, for us, rather unlovable...If we haven't fallen in love with God, we will probably find a lot of people not to our liking. But if we do love God with all our heart, mind, and soul, we will love those whom he loves - which means everyone." I know, easier said than done, but with God all things are possible. Let us strive to follow the first and second most important commandments with Jesus' help.

FYI: The pedal reservoir (part that holds the air) for our church organ was repaired this past week. The church sound system replacement has not yet been scheduled, but we anticipate later this fall. Thanks to generous supporters we have it covered financially. Thank you!

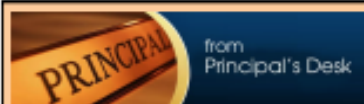

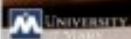

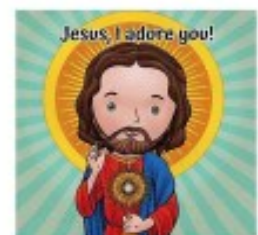


Children's Adoration :

If you are wondering if your child is too young or too old for this, the answer is "no" they are not too young or too old. If you are worried about your child acting out during this time, that's ok, don't let it deter you from coming. No one is perfect, and we understand we all have tough moments. God understands too, and loves when we come into his Eucharistic presence. I lead the children in about 10-15 minutes of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance on the altar, and then the children go to O'Neill Hall for activities, while the parents can remain in Adoration. 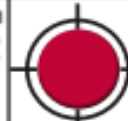
