

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners.

Have you considered stopping in the church for Eucharistic Adoration sometime throughout the week? Doing so might just change your life for the better. Jesus will bring peace to your life and teach you to turn everything over to him. In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul says to "have no anxiety at all, but to make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God which is beyond all understanding will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus...Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the peace of God will be with you." Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, which is Jesus' true presence in the Sacred Host, cannot help but transform us. Look at Jesus, with faith and trust, speak to him authentically and freely from the depths of your heart, and he will respond to you with all the love in his heart. In fact, God speaks to us first and our prayer is a response to God's initiative. If you knew Jesus was before you now, and he is, what would he say to you...what would you say to him? Eucharistic Adoration, time spent in his presence, allows us a great opportunity to have that conversation. We have times of Adoration Monday through Friday, but you can certainly come anytime to pray as Jesus is present in the tabernacle. If you want to commit to signing up for a consistent hour of Adoration, please call the parish office. We can certainly use more scheduled Adorers.


