Dear Parishioners.

Jesus told his disciples the parable of the man who went on a journey and called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents (a unit of money), to another two, and to another one. The first two servants invested their money and doubled it. The last one took his money and buried it. When the master in the parable returns, he praises the first two and says to them, "Come, share your master's joy." The one who buried the treasure gets scolded. What is the message of this parable? May we all hear those beautiful words now and at the end of our life!

# The 40% ND Tax Credit

North Dakota established a Tax Credit (ND Century Code 57-38-01.21) that allows individuals, businesses, trusts, and estates to take advantage of a 40% state tax credit for contributions of \$5,000 or more to qualified ND charitable endowment funds. Even better, the unused portion of that state tax credit can be carried forward for three years.

Assuming the marginal tax rate on an individual return is as listed and the donor can benefit from itemizing deductions on Federal Schedule A.

North Dakata individual income tax rates are currently in the range of approximately 1.1% to 2.9% of federal taxable income. The general provisions of North Dakota's Tax Credit (ND Century Code 57-38-01.21) are as follows:

- 1) A 40% state income tax credit can be taken on contributions to qualified North Dakota-based charitable endowment funds.
- 2) Contributions can be made by individuals, businesses, trusts, or estates.
- 3) To qualify, the contribution must be a minimum of \$5,000.
- 4) The maximum North Dakota tax credit is \$10,000 for single tax filers and \$20,000 for those who are married and filing jointly. The maximum tax credit for a single individual would be \$10,000, equal to 40% of a \$25,000 contribution. The maximum tax credit for a married couple would be \$20,000, equal to 40% of a \$50,000 contribution.

5) The unused portion of the North Dakota state income tax credit can be carried forward for three years.

The IRA Charitable Rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made directly to our parish.

# If ...

- You are at least 70<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
- You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions.



Reduce your taxable income even if you do not itemize deductions!

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and state income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

(The 2019 SECURE Act may require part or all of your distribution to be reported as income, for a small number of people.) The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian.
Tell them you want to make a qualified charitable distribution.
In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

#### Important information!

Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to our parish. If you receive the money first then you will be taxed on it like any other distribution.

#### Example:

Mrs. Connors, age 76, has a traditional IRA account and would like to contribute \$3,000 to our parish in 2022. She directs her custodian of her IRA (her bank, investment or insurance company that has her IRA) to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2022 directly to our parish as a 2022 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her qualified charitable distribution.

Gifts from the Harvest

(Grain, Corn, Beans, Cattle, etc.)

#### Sharing Your Harvest ... more effectively

Cash basis farmers who harvest their crops in the fall and make their plans for spring planting often find that making charitable gifts is a great way to do tax planning. As with all charity and tax planning, one should first consult his/her financial and legal advisers. The example below, illustrates for many farmers, at least considering a "gift from the harvest" might be the most effective way to "share your harvest."

The reasons such a gift might be advantageous are several, but the primary are:

- · Reduction of income to the extent of the value of the commodity.
- Deduction of production costs from the past growing season.
- In many cases, elimination of the self-employment tax attributed to the commodity.
- Effective reduction of adjusted gross income, helping reduce the income on which tax is assessed, and allowing larger giving not limited to 50% of adjusted gross income.

#### Procedure: Please see back for instructions.

To accomplish a "gift from the harvest", be sure to contact our office at (701) 572-6731. We can provide the forms and information by which your elevator may transfer ownership to the Diocese, your parish, school or other ministry directly prior to sale, thereby ensuring the favorable tax treatment desired by such a gift.

When you decide to make a "gift from the harvest", make sure you give our contact information to the elevator, so we can take responsibility for the sale.
