From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners.

The entire month of November is a particularly blessed time to pray for all the souls in purgatory. These souls of our deceased loved ones are still in need of purification before entering spotless, and immaculate, paradise. Nothing impure can enter heaven. It is a great mercy, and a matter of the justice of God, to have a stage of purgation for souls. These souls had their sins forgiven, but had not made full restitution or satisfaction for the harm their sins had caused on earth. When a person's sins are forgiven in the Sacrament of Confession a penance is given. This penance is meant to "make up" "make satisfaction" for the harm caused by sin. The church refers to it as "temporal (meaning ...in time, in this world) punishment due to sin", and this "just punishment" is reduced and even eliminated completely through authentic penance, true prayer from the heart, fasting, works of charity, and through plenary indulgences granted by the church. Because of our belief in the Communion of Saints (i.e. that we are still connected intimately with those who have died, through the power of Christ), we can pray for the souls in purgatory and help them. The prayer of St. Gertrude is common and I encourage you to pray it daily, "Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen." My Mom prayed this prayer every day. She died a year ago, on November 2nd, the feast of All Souls. I had Mass at her bedside while she lay dying and she took her last breath after the Gospel reading from John 6:37-40, "For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day. The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ." This was a great comfort to our family. It was Mom's way of teaching her children, one last time, to always pray for the souls in purgatory, and to put our faith in Jesus and his power to raise us to eternal life. I encourage you to have Masses offered for your loved ones, and the living for that matter. Novena Prayers for the souls in purgatory are traditionally prayed from Oct. 24 - Nov. 2nd, but you can pray it anytime for nine straight days. Find the prayers online at scripturecatholic.com or do a simple google search. May all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen. Blessings,
