

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

It has been said that if the only prayer we can muster is a simple "THANK YOU GOD", that would suffice. That is because "Thank you" is the most powerful phrase in the universe. Saying thank you to God acknowledges our need for him. When we recognize our need for God, we are clear as to our relationship to him. We rightly say "He is God and I am not!" Thanksgiving is a path toward the heart of God. Just as the Samaritan leper who was healed along with the other nine, but the only one who returned to give thanks, we too, can follow his example and return to give thanks for the ways he has healed. If there is more healing to be had in your life, and we all need it, continue to ask God for it and thank him ahead of time for answering your prayers. You will find that thanking God ahead of time strengthens your faith and commitment to following the path he has laid out for you. I remember one time eating at a fast-food restaurant and witnessing a little boy being going to the counter to order an ice cream cone. An elderly woman in line noticed the boy struggling to get his order relayed to the cashier and so she helped him out. The boy came to his dad all smiles with his ice cream cone and the father asked the boy, "did you thank her?" The little boy returned and said "thank you" to the woman, who said "you're welcome". Though there was no physical healing involved in this story, it always reminds me of the leper returning to Jesus to thank him once he recognized what he had been healed. Let us acknowledge the ways in which God, and those around us, help us out each day, and thank them from the bottom of our heart. Let me just say to YOU reading this now, as I have likely encountered you and been blessed by your presence.... Thank you...for being a blessing to me. I appreciate you!

Dive Deeper into knowing the person of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. As a response to the Eucharistic Revival inaugurated by The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Bismarck Diocese has partnered with University of Mary to bring a team of college students on fire to evangelize, to your city and offer a deep Eucharistic Retreat experience. The mission of these retreats is to provide a space where young people can experience the love of God in a renewed and transformative way. The title Emmaus is derived from chapter 24 of Luke's gospel— where Jesus draws near to His discouraged disciples. The Emmaus Youth retreats are lead by the University of Mary Ministry team and the Bismarck Diocese. The retreats will feature talks, activates, music, Eucharistic Adoration, Mass, and fellowship with other young Catholics. There will be 5 different retreats, 1 in each deanery. Blessings to you as we share our 2024-2025 first Annual State of the Parish Report! St. Joseph's was incorporated as a parish in 1901 and ever since has been sharing the faith in Jesus Christ to the people of the Williston area. As we review some parish statistics from this past year, I am reminded of the words of Jesus just before he ascended into heaven, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

We have been blessed with many infant/youth baptisms, a sign of a vibrant parish. In addition, we have received many adults, and sometimes entire families, into full communion with the Catholic Church. Those new to our parish often tell me how warm and welcomed they feel at our parish. Thank you for welcoming people. When you come to Mass, make it a point to introduce yourself to someone new each week. This will only serve to strengthen parish's mission to make Christ known in the world. For Jesus says, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them."

Serving Christ in the poor is a hallmark of our parish, and we thank you for your generosity to our Good Samaritan Program and/or the St. Vincent De Paul Society. Daily at St. Joe's our parish staff warmly welcomes visitors in need whom we can support through these programs.


Our parish school has been expanding. These past two years we added 7th and 8th grades, which we have not had since 1970. Currently, we do not plan to expand beyond that, but the addition of junior high has been a blessing indeed. Two years ago, our new Little Joe's Early Childhood Education Center opened its doors. Little Joe's is a year-round center for infants through pre-school. Our Parish Faith Formation program serving grades K-12, and our adult formation opportunities have expanded. Our Veritas program for our high school students has taken off, as has Proverbs Pub for our college age group, and the Leo XIV (ages 18-29) and John Paul II (ages 30-39) groups, which have served to keep our young people engaged.

Please continue to pray for our parish family. I invite you to take part in Eucharistic Adoration at St. Joe's. Adoration will change your life for the better. Jesus has so much to say to you. First and foremost, that he loves you and he is glad you are here worshipping him at St. Joe's. If you are not Catholic but think you might want to join, I invite you to come talk to us and we will walk with you. If you consider yourself a lukewarm Catholic but would like to be on fire with your faith, start with Eucharistic Adoration, begin a daily habit of prayer, participate at Mass, find ways to share your time and talent. Thank you for your presence and your prayers.





1 Endowment accounts are invested through the Catholic Foundation of Western North Dakota (CFWND). In an endowment fund, the money donated (the principal) always stays intact and is never spent. The donations are wisely invested in socially and morally responsible funds. Every year we may take up to 4% of our balance as long as we have accrued enough interest.

2 An agency account performs similar to a 3 year Bank CD. The money is invested with CFWND. After 3 years the principal and earnings can be withdrawn. They have averaged over a 6% return since its inception. The plan would be to only use the interest earned on these accounts. The funds will become available in October 2027. These funds were previously in a savings account earning 2%.





The purpose of this endowment fund is to provide a perpetual source of income for the financial health of our school and parish. Typically, 4 percent of the endowment value is distributed to our school and parish. **All donations to this endowment fund are tax deductible as allowed by federal law.**

State Tax Credit

Your gift may also be eligible for special tax credits!

40% TAX CREDIT ND Endowment Fund Contribution Credit:

A ND donor can receive a 40% state tax credit on donations from \$5,000 up to \$25,000 (\$50,000 if married filing jointly) to St. Joseph's Catholic School's Endowment Fund.

50% TAX CREDIT ND Nonprofit Private School Tax Credit:

A ND donor can receive the following state tax credits for donations to St. Joseph's Catholic School (Primary Schools): a 50% tax credit on donations up to \$5,000.



PRIVACY & SECURITY

- Your digital *Instant Church Directory* account is protected by a username and password that only you will know. *Instant Church Directory* takes your privacy very seriously.
- Only St. Joseph parishioners can log in to our digital directory, and once that parishioner is removed, they no longer have access.
- Directory data is stored using a private cloud environment in a private data center. *Instant Church Directory* uses industry best practices for securing and backing up their servers and data, including 24/7 monitoring of their servers for possible intrusions.
- If you have at any time supplied St. Joseph's parish office with an email address, by default that email address and your family's name will appear in the printed and digital directory and will be viewable by other parishioners, even if you do nothing. If you would like to opt out of being included in the directory, please contact the parish office at 572-6731.

Any information provided by you will be viewable by other parishioners, so only add information that you don't mind other parishioners viewing. We ask that you please include at least the following:

- * First names of family members (click **Add Adult/Parent** or **Add Child**)
- * A family (or individual) photo (click **Upload Photo**)

• Please note: If you change your family email, you will need to choose "Create Login" the next time you try to log in on a web browser or the mobile app.

• Click the **Submit Edits** button. Each time you make a change and click **Submit Edits**, your submission needs to be reviewed by the parish office. To see the edits you made, you will need to wait at least 24 hours for your submission to be approved by the parish office.
