# From the Pastor's Desk

On May 8th the College of Cardinals elected as Pope, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, who took the name of Pope Leo XIV. Our new Pope is from Chicago and a member of the Augustinian Order. He served several decades as a missionary in Peru, was eventually appointed the Bishop of Chiclayu, Peru, and has dual citizenship in both the United States and Peru. He served as the Provincial of the Augustinian Order for many years. In 2023 he was made a Cardinal by Pope Francis and appointed Prefect of the Dicastery of Bishops (i.e. In charge of aiding the selection of new Bishops for dioceses throughout the world.) Pope Leo's first words from the balcony to the world were, "Peace be with you all!" He said that true peace comes from the risen Christ, "a peace that comes from God, the God who loves us all, unconditionally." He referred to himself as a "son of Augustine," the 5th century Bishop of Hippo in North Africa and one of the greatest theologians of all time. The Pope quoted from St. Augustine, "For you I am a bishop, but with you I am a Christian." His episcopal motto is "In Illo Uno Unum" which translates as "In the One, we are one." This motto is from a sermon by St. Augustine on Psalm 27, and emphasizes that the unity of the Church is found in the one Christ, the head, so that the head and members together form the "whole Christ." His love of the Blessed Virgin Mary was evident in that he led the gathered crowd in the Hail Mary before his first papal blessing. Let us all be sure to pray for our new Pope that he be filled with wisdom, courage, and strength to be the Shepherd that God has called him to be.


