From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Last Saturday I got up early (3am) to watch the funeral of Pope Francis. It was a beautiful and touching Mass. The gospel proclaimed was the same as the one we hear this weekend from John 21:1-19. It is one of my favorite resurrection appearance accounts in the gospels. Peter (the first Pope) and the others had gone fishing and caught nothing all night. When it was morning, they saw a man on the shore (it was Jesus but they didn't know that yet) who told them to cast their nets on the right side of the boat for a catch. For some mysterious grace-filled reason they obey and make a huge catch (I've tried casting my rod onto the other side of the boat when I've been out fishing... It doesn't usually work for me!). They realize it is Jesus, and in his excitement, Peter jumps in to swim to see Jesus. He is around a charcoal fire (remember the last time Peter is around a charcoal fire...he denied Jesus three times), and has fish and bread for them, but asks them to bring some of the fish they just caught. I love that detail...Jesus asks us for our help and sees the value in what we bring him, because it is a catch made from his grace and the obedience of his disciples! Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him, to which Peter responds (this time with a deep conviction, but a deep humility in his weakness) that he does love him. Jesus says "feed my sheep". Our next Pope, whom-ever it will be, will have the same mission given by Jesus as did the first Bishop of Rome (Peter) and our most recent (Francis). May Pope Francis rest in peace, and may God grant wisdom to our College of Cardinals as they gather to elect the next Pope.
