Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,


As we prepare for our groundbreaking on Monday, people have expressed a lot of mixed emotion to me. While it is exciting to be planning and building for the future, at the same time it is sad to consider that one day soon we will leave a church building we have known for so long.

This is not, however, the first time the parish has relocated. A note in a baptismal record says that Mass was celebrated in 1868 "at Holy Cross—then situated on the East of the Red River." By 1870, we know that Holy Cross Mission was located on the *west side* of the Red River. When did it move? In 1882, a new church was built at the current location. So, after 140 years, we are moving on.

From time to time, I return to our "Campaign Prayer." It begins with praise and trust of God: "Heavenly Father, we turn to you with grateful hearts for what we have, and with great anticipation for what is yet to be." Who could have imagined ten years ago (when serious discussion began about the future of our parish) what this project has become today? The prayer looks back—acknowledging that we are building upon the firm faith of those who have gone before us—and looks forward: "Please guide our parish's efforts to embrace our tradition and build our future." It ends with an act of confidence and petition for help: "Strengthen us and bless us with your presence, now and forever." May these words penetrate our spirits and reassure us that we are doing God's will.

As we break ground for the future home of St. Benedict, let us remember that God is faithful. May the witness of the saints throughout history, especially St. Benedict of Nursia, help us realize that we do not have a permanent home here, but that God has prepared a place for us in heaven.

Crayons for Kids Project



This marks the third year that St. Benedict's parish will put together school supply replenishment bags for food insecure children whose families get food

at the Emergency Food Pantry. Many of these children get backpacks loaded with supplies through United Way in the fall, but these supplies do not last an entire year. In December we help families with new pencils, pens, erasers, glue sticks and boxes of 24 crayons.
