Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

The Lord Comes

Today we mark the beginning of Advent. The name of the season comes from a Latin word meaning "arrival" or "coming." Two thousand years ago, the Son of God came into the world, when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. The next time he will come in visible form will be at the end of the world. In between these two "arrivals", Jesus comes into our hearts.



First Sunday of Advent

On this First Sunday of Advent, the Church continues the reflection on the end of time which we have been pondering for the past month. The Gospel today is a continuation of the Eschatological ("End of the World") Talk Jesus gave his disciples during Holy Week. Jesus says that his Second Coming will be sudden and unexpected. The same Jesus who was born in great poverty and practically unnoticed on Christmas day will come in glory on the Last Day. In his first coming, he was on a mission of mercy; his final coming will be a day of judgment. While we still have the chance, let us receive his mercy and prepare for the day when we will meet him face to face.

The theme of judgment is clearly stated in our First Reading from the prophet Isaiah. In the Second Reading, St. Paul encourages us to "throw off the works of darkness." This theme will be continued next Sunday, when we encounter St. John the Baptist. As he prepared the way when Jesus came the first time, John's words should stir us to receive Jesus anew in our hearts. His cry of "Repent!" should cause us to examine ourselves, see how imperfectly we live as Christians and inspire us to change. In this way, John prepares us for Jesus' Second Coming.

The coming of Jesus two thousand years ago forever changed mankind's relationship with God. In the meantime, we await his Second Coming. As each day of our lives brings us closer to that moment; each day we should accept him into our hearts, so that day will not catch us off guard.

May St. John the Baptist help us to receive Jesus' coming into our lives today.

- Holy Cross, West Fargo, Sunday, January 22, 2:00-4:30 p.m.
- Sts. Anne and Joachim, Fargo, Tuesday, January 24, 6:30-9:00 p.m.

The complete schedule is available at www.fargodiocese.org/synod or in the November issue of *New Earth*.

Each session will begin with a period of meditating on Sacred Scripture and praying to Jesus. This will be followed by a time of reflecting on and discussing these questions: What are the top three things that are working well at your parish and the diocese? What are the top three challenges to address in your parish and the diocese? What is one step I might be called to take to respond?

Again, these steps are the initial stages for the preparation for the Third Synod of the Diocese of Fargo. As time goes on, we will be engaged in the additional steps. Please pray for the success of the Synod, as well as the impact it will have on us here at St. Benedict.

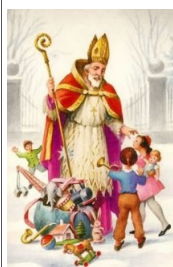
