PASTOR'S NOTES

This weekend is Catholic Charities Sunday. It is a time for us to reflect how Catholic Charities North Dakota (CCND) serves people in our area on behalf of the Catholic Church.

In 1923, Msgr. Vincent Ryan, then pastor of St. Anthony's Church in Fargo, started the Catholic Welfare Bureau. He saw the need to help unmarried mothers, find homes for the children at St. John's Orphanage in Fargo, and serve others in need. In 1937, Fr. Anthony Peschel was trained as a social worker at Notre Dame and became one of the first in the state of North Dakota. Under his leadership in the 1950's, more professionally trained social workers were hired at the agency. (Msgr. Peschel became pastor of St. Benedict in 1973 and served here until his retirement in 1987. He died in 1998 at the age of 89.) In 1974, Roger Schwinghammer was hired as the first lay director of the agency. In the early 2000s, the organization changed its name to "Catholic Charities North Dakota" and become affiliated with other Catholic Charities agencies throughout the United States. Their mission of showing care and compassion was unchanged.

Last year CCND celebrated 100 years of service in the Dioceses of Fargo and Bismarck. As they enters their second century of serving the poor, needy and struggling in North Dakota, please keep them in your prayers. Jesus said, "The poor you will always have with you." These words are a challenge to us, inviting us to look around and see how we can reach out to others in need. Supporting CCND is one way we can show this love to others.

St. Benedict saw Christ in all people. May he intercede for CCND, as they imitate Jesus and be a Good Samaritan to help strangers in need.




