

Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Every Catholic recognizes this as the "program" for Lent. It is what we do during Lent. As we will hear in the Gospel on Ash Wednesday, Jesus himself endorsed these practices. Since the beginning of the Church, Christians have recognized these as fruitful ways of practicing penance and becoming holy.

The Catholic Church helps us by explicitly answering the question, "What penance should I do for Lent?" The regulations for fasting and abstinence are on the enclosed flyer. In summary, there are two days when we are required to fast (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), and eight days when we are required to abstain from meat (Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday). This is a minimum. Nothing prevents us from doing more. If we are considering additional days of fast, the advice we will hear is that it should not interfere with our daily duties. It would be imprudent, for example, for a construction worker involved in heavy labor to fast every day.

Abstinence is defined as not eating the flesh of certain land animals (cows, chickens, pigs, etc.). This does not include food made from meat juices (such as broth, consommé, gravy or soup) or other products (such as milk, cheese, butter, gelatin, eggs, etc.) derived from these animals. However, nothing prevents us from eliminating some of these categories of food as well.

While it is good to ask, "What do we do for Lent?", we also need to understand why do we do these things. The 40 days of Lent are to help us grow spiritually. Over the next few weeks, I will explore how prayer, fasting, and almsgiving help us to become saints. In the meantime, my prayer for you is that you have a good beginning of your Lenten journey; that you take seriously the invitation to turn away from sin and believe in the Good News.
