Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

In the readings for Ash Wednesday, we hear Jesus support the practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. He says that they should be seen by our heavenly Father, and not flaunted before others. To guide in our Lenten practices, the Catholic Church provides regulations for fasting and abstinence. These are the minimum effort we are to make. We can ask, why do Christians fast?

The First Reading from Ash Wednesday presents one of the reasons why we fast: "be converted to me with all your heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning" (Joel 2:12). We practice fasting to turn away from sin. Christians need to be living lives of ongoing conversion and fasting is an integral part of this process.

Another spiritual benefit of fasting is to "help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, number 2043). It is a sign of hope in God's mercy. God comes to us with his grace in our weakness, and assures us that we can be free of the things of this world.

Another spiritual benefit for fasting is to prepare our hearts for the coming of God. In the Book of the Prophet Daniel, we hear that Daniel fasted for three weeks before he received a revelation from God (Daniel 10:2ff). Through fasting, our thoughts are raised to heavenly things, our mind is focused on a greater desire to know God, and our desires are purified to seek God, our greatest good.

In the Decree granting the Jubilee Year Indulgence, the Church proposes an interesting way of fasting: "In particular, the penitential nature of Friday can be rediscovered through abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week from futile distractions (real but also virtual distractions, for example, the use of the media and/or social networks), from superfluous consumption, ... as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor". During Lent, I invite you to take seriously this invitation to avoid the distraction and futility of social media. Focus on spiritual works that build up your relationship with our God and those around you.


