Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

Today we begin the holiest time of the year. While we are awed by the Nativity—God taking flesh to live among us—and the miracles of Jesus—the presence of the power of God in our midst—nothing compares to the incredible love we witness in Jesus dying for us. I invite you to take time to ponder this love each day this week.

For example, you could slowly meditate on the words of the Passion in St. Luke's Gospel. Consider all the individuals Jesus encounters, and their motives for reacting to him as they do. Then reflect on your response to Jesus in your life. What prevents you from receiving his love? What prevents you from being selfless, as he was selfless? A "traditional" devotion is the Stations of the Cross. Instead of traveling to Jerusalem and retracing Jesus' steps, we accompany him through prayer. There are Stations of the Cross booklets near the Stations in the social hall. A "modern" devotion is the Divine Mercy Novena. It begins on Good Friday and ends the Sunday after Easter. There is a theme for each of the nine days, invoking God's mercy on particular groups of people. You can find a flyer containing all the prayers on our pamphlet rack.

However, nothing compares to the liturgies of the Church. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the celebration of the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday, and the Easter Masses, walk us through the Paschal Mystery. Through liturgy, we not only commemorate what Jesus did 2,000 years ago, we witness and experience his love present in our midst. The culmination of our celebrations will be the Easter Vigil. Please pray for those preparing to enter into Full Communion that night: Kelsey Gunderson, Trista, Natalie, Collin, Owen and Everett Johnson, Susie and Madelyn Ouradnik. Additionally, Shawn Ouradnik will complete the process of Christian Initiation by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation.

May this Holy Week give us a deeper taste of the bitterness Jesus suffered in his passion and death for our sins. May it open our hearts to the love of our Heavenly Father and the outpouring of new life in the Holy Spirit.
