Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

Throughout the United States this weekend we celebrate the fifth annual World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Back in February, Pope Francis announced the theme: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope," a quote from the Book of Sirach. It was inspired by the theme of the Jubilee Year, "Pilgrims of Hope." Pope Leo, his successor, wrote the annual Message. In it he included words Pope Francis wrote during his final hospitalization: "our bodies are weak, but even so, nothing can prevent us from loving, praying, giving ourselves, being there for one another, in faith, as shining signs of hope"

In his Message, Pope Leo reflected on people in Sacred Scripture who were old. He wrote, "In the Bible, God repeatedly demonstrates his providential care by turning to people in their later years. This was the case not only with Abraham and Sarah, Zechariah and Elizabeth, but also with Moses, who was called to set his people free when he was already eighty years old. God thus teaches us that, in his eyes, old age is a time of blessing and grace, and that the elderly are, for him, the first witnesses of hope. St. Augustine asks, 'What do we mean by old age?' He tells us that God himself answers the question: 'Let your strength fail, so that my strength may abide within you, and you can say with the Apostle, "When I am weak, then I am strong.""

Pope Leo continues, "Looking at the elderly in the spirit of this Jubilee, we are called to help them experience liberation, especially from loneliness and abandonment. This year is a fitting time to do so. God's fidelity to his promises teaches us that there is a blessedness in old age. ... That is why Pope Francis wanted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly to be celebrated primarily through an effort to seek out elderly persons who are living alone. ... Visiting an elderly person is a way of encountering Jesus, who frees us from indifference and loneliness."
