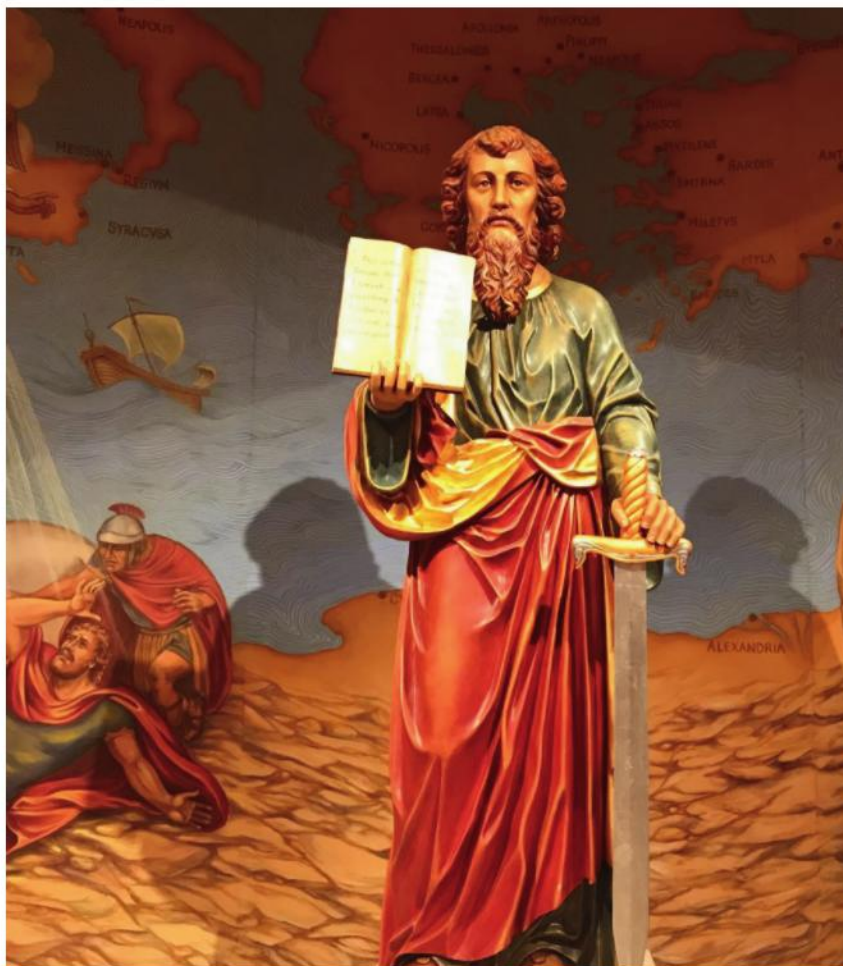

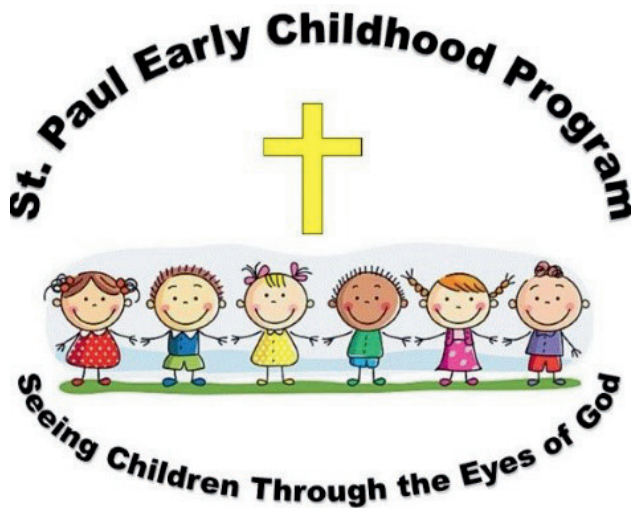

Catholic Lenten Practices

Giving up something for Lent, eating fish on Fridays and fasting from meat, almsgiving and penance throughout the [forty days of Lent](#)—these are some of the practices for which Catholics are known. But why do we as Catholics do this? Because through these commitments—known as “Lenten practices” or “Lenten disciplines”—the Catholic Church calls us each year to renew our discipleship in Christ. Specifically, each year during the liturgical season of Lent the Church asks us to pray, give alms, and fast.

Pray We know the importance of prayer in our lives—as individuals, as families, and as a community. Prayer is especially important during Lent. The Lenten season is a time for reflection, evaluation, and repentance. As the booklet [Praying Lent](#) (Loyola Press, 2009) says, Lent asks us: “What needs changing?” Lent calls us to a personal conversion and renewal—to a recommitted life in Christ so that we might not just celebrate Easter forty days later but also feel the risen Christ alive in us and in the world. This means prayer. During Lent we set aside time for prayer that is reflective in nature and reveals places where we have failed to open ourselves to God.

Give Every day we witness situations of injustice, violence, and hatred. Television and the Internet bring these into our living rooms, but we also observe and live them in our own cities and homes. The Church calls us during Lent to be especially conscious of the needs of others and to act accordingly. Giving materially to another is an act of Christian charity known as “almsgiving.” During Lent, the Church also calls us to first convert ourselves and then to transform the world for justice, so that we might serve the Kingdom which Jesus lived and preached.

Sacrifice Fasting and abstinence are not sacrifices for the sake of pain or vain discomfort. Sacrifice for the sake of sacrifice is not a Christian virtue. We are asked by the Catholic Church to fast on [Ash Wednesday](#) and Good Friday, and not to eat meat on the Fridays of Lent. Feeling an empty stomach, or fighting the urge to have that juicy steak or candy bar does more than just remind us that for some people an empty stomach is their daily bread. Fasting and abstinence help us to ask ourselves the question: “What sustains me and gives me life?” What nourishes me on my journey of life? We will find the answer, not in the steak or the candy bar, but at the end of these forty days of Lent—in the Resurrection of Jesus. We fast and abstain because, when we do, we are reminded of who we are—followers of the risen Christ. As Catholics, we joyfully engage in Lenten disciplines because we are disciples (and yes, both words have the same root). We pray, give (almsgiving), and sacrifice (fast) because we follow Christ, who loved us so much that gave his own life so that we might share in Eternal Life.



Prácticas católicas de Cuaresma

Renunciar a algo en Cuaresma, comer pescado los viernes y ayunar de carne, hacer limosna y penitencia durante los [cuarenta días de Cuaresma](#): éstas son algunas de las prácticas por las que se conoce a los católicos. Pero, ¿por qué hacemos esto los católicos? Porque a través de estos compromisos—conocidos como “prácticas cuaresmales” o “disciplinas cuaresmales”—la Iglesia católica nos llama cada año a renovar nuestro discipulado en Cristo. En concreto, cada año, durante el tiempo litúrgico de la Cuaresma, la Iglesia nos pide que recemos, demos limosna y ayunemos.

Rez Conocemos la importancia de la oración en nuestras vidas, como individuos, como familias y como comunidad. La oración es especialmente importante durante la Cuaresma. La Cuaresma es un tiempo de reflexión, evaluación y arrepentimiento. Como dice el folleto [Praying Lent](#) (Loyola Press, 2009), la Cuaresma nos pregunta: “¿Qué hay que cambiar?”. La Cuaresma nos llama a una conversión y renovación personales—a un nuevo compromiso de vida en Cristo—para que no nos limitemos a celebrar la Pascua cuarenta días después, sino que sintamos a Cristo resucitado vivo en nosotros y en el mundo. Esto significa oración. Durante la Cuaresma reservamos tiempo para la oración, que es de naturaleza reflexiva y revela los lugares en los que no nos hemos abierto a Dios.

Dar Cada día somos testigos de situaciones de injusticia, violencia y odio. La televisión e Internet las llevan a nuestros salones, pero también las observamos y vivimos en nuestras propias ciudades y hogares. La Iglesia nos llama durante la Cuaresma a ser especialmente conscientes de las necesidades de los demás y a actuar en consecuencia. Dar materialmente a otro es un acto de caridad cristiana conocido como “limosna”. Durante la Cuaresma, la Iglesia también nos llama a convertirnos primero nosotros mismos y luego a transformar el mundo por la justicia, para que podamos servir al Reino que Jesús vivió y predicó.

Sacrificio El ayuno y la abstinencia no son sacrificios por el dolor o la vana incomodidad. El sacrificio por el sacrificio no es una virtud cristiana. La Iglesia Católica nos pide que ayunemos el [Miércoles de Ceniza](#) y el Viernes Santo, y que no comamos carne los viernes de Cuaresma. Sentir el estómago vacío o luchar contra el impulso de comer ese jugoso filete o esa chocolatina hace algo más que recordarnos que para algunas personas el estómago vacío es el pan de cada día. El ayuno y la abstinencia nos ayudan a hacernos la pregunta: “¿Qué me sostiene y me da vida?”. ¿Qué me alimenta en mi viaje por la vida? Encontraremos la respuesta, no en el filete ni en la chocolatina, sino al final de estos cuarenta días de Cuaresma: en la Resurrección de Jesús. Ayunamos y nos abstenemos porque, cuando lo hacemos, recordamos quiénes somos: seguidores de Cristo resucitado.

Como católicos, participamos con alegría en las disciplinas cuaresmales porque somos discípulos (y sí, ambas palabras tienen la misma raíz). Rezamos, damos (limosna) y nos sacrificamos (ayuno) porque seguimos a Cristo, que nos amó tanto que dio su propia vida para que pudiéramos compartir la Vida Eterna.

Deserts Deserts were dangerous places physically because they offered little food or water, and shelter was usually a mere cave. Deserts thus came to represent spiritual struggle or challenge. People went into the desert to confront their demons and to learn to depend solely on God. They fasted as a test of their endurance and commitment.

True son Jesus enters the desert soon after God calls him his beloved Son (3:17). In the desert Jesus demonstrates the kind of son he is. Matthew contrasts the forty days Jesus spends in the wilderness with the forty years that Israel spent in the Sinai desert. The Israelites, sometimes called collectively the son of God, had to learn to trust in God, but too often they complained about not having food or water or about being attacked by foreign tribes. Jesus is the true Son who acts with perfect trust and obedience.

Dueling in the desert At his baptism Jesus entrusted himself to God. The devil tests his commitment in stages. Notice that Jesus withstands each temptation by speaking God's word rather than depending on his own arguments.

1. Jesus trusts completely in God (v.4). He won't turn away from God in order to depend on himself, which is the great sin of humankind that our first reading dramatizes.
2. The devil can use scripture, too (v.6). He quotes God's word in order to turn Jesus' trust in God against him. Jesus doesn't fall for it: genuine trust in God doesn't demand proof or signs of love. Jesus also uses scripture correctly instead of distorting it for his own purposes. His proper use of scripture highlights his divine authority, an authority he refuses to misuse.
3. Although Jesus will reign over the whole world, he can't skip past his ministry and crucifixion in order to arrive quickly at his resurrection and ascension (vv.8-10). He must remain patient and faithful to God's plan of salvation, no matter how hard God's mission for him becomes.

Desiertos Los desiertos eran lugares peligrosos físicamente porque ofrecían poca comida o agua, y el refugio solía ser una mera cueva. Así, los desiertos pasaron a representar la lucha o el desafío espiritual. La gente se adentraba en el desierto para enfrentarse a sus demonios y aprender a depender únicamente de Dios. Ayunaban como prueba de resistencia y compromiso.

Hijo verdadero Jesús entra en el desierto poco después de que Dios le llame Hijo amado (3,17). En el desierto Jesús demuestra la clase de hijo que es. Mateo contrasta los cuarenta días que Jesús pasa en el desierto con los cuarenta años de su vida con los cuarenta años que Israel pasó en el desierto del Sinaí. Los israelitas, a veces llamados colectivamente el hijo de Dios, tuvieron que aprender a confiar en Dios, pero con demasiada frecuencia se quejaban de no tener comida ni agua o de ser atacados por tribus extranjeras. Jesús es el verdadero Hijo que actúa con perfecta confianza y obediencia.

Duelo en el desierto En su bautismo, Jesús se encomendó a Dios. El diablo pone a prueba su compromiso por etapas. Observa que Jesús resiste a cada tentación pronunciando la palabra de Dios en lugar de depender de sus propios argumentos.

1. Jesús confía plenamente en Dios (v. 4). No se apartará de Dios para depender de sí mismo, que es el gran pecado de la humanidad que nuestra primera lectura dramatiza nuestra primera lectura.
2. El diablo también puede utilizar las Escrituras (v. 6). Cita la palabra de Dios para volver contra él la confianza de Jesús en Dios. Jesús no cae en la trampa: la auténtica confianza en Dios no exige pruebas ni signos de amor. Jesús también utiliza las Escrituras correctamente, en lugar de distorsionarlas para sus propios fines. Su uso correcto de las Escrituras pone de relieve su autoridad divina, una autoridad que se niega a utilizar para sus propios fines, una autoridad de la que se niega a abusar.
3. Aunque Jesús reinará sobre todo el mundo, no puede saltarse su ministerio y crucifixión para llegar rápidamente a su resurrección y ascensión (vv.8-10). Debe permanecer paciente y fiel al plan de salvación de Dios, por duro que sea. salvación, por dura que sea la misión que Dios le ha encomendado.

St. Paul the Apostle Early Childhood Program Presents: Summer Enrichment & Summer Daycare 2023

Registration for Summer Enrichment & Summer Daycare opens March 1st!!!

Summer Enrichment is a 6 week program beginning June 5th and running through July 13th. The weeks are separated into themes: the first two weeks we will explore Space; the second two weeks we will go camping; and the third two weeks we will visit the Circus. You may choose to enroll your child in any combination of weeks that you wish. For example, you may want your child to just learn about



the circus, or go camping, or only participate in one week within each theme. You may also want to enroll them for all six weeks. Any choice of weeks can be accommodated but there is a limit on how many can enroll each week, so please get your registration forms in as soon as you can. This program is open to children from 1 year (must be walking) to 7 years old. Each week costs \$85 and includes registration, supply, and tuition fees. Hours are from 9:30 am – 1:30 pm, Tuesday, Wednesday, and



Thursday each week during the 6 week period. An updated immunization form is required for each student in order to enroll in all summer programs and must be turned in with the registration form.

Summer Daycare is available from 8 am – 3 pm Monday through Friday, in the same options as offered during the school year.

Many families have both parents who work and need this service throughout the summer. All children who register for summer daycare will be able to experience the enrichment program at no additional cost. There is a one-time \$50 registration and supply fee for summer daycare, but the monthly tuition will remain the same as during the 2022/2023 school year. Summer daycare runs from June 5th through August 4th. Registration for fall will open on April 1st.
