

Tuesday is the Solemnity of All Saints. It is a Holy Day of obligation this year. St Mary will have Masses at 7a.m., 8:30a.m. (school), and 6:30p.m. Come rejoice in the Communion of Saints, who spend their time in heaven adoring God and interceding for the us, the Body of Christ still on earth.

As is our custom, the 10a Mass next Sunday, Nov 6 will be outdoors at the Calvary Cemetery, weather permitting. Please plan accordingly. This annual practice allows us to recognize and pray for our beloved dead who went before us here at St

Mary. Even in death, we love and respect them. Please come and pray for the repose of their souls.

On the first Friday of each month for the last several years, St Mary has hosted Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament following the 8:30a morning Mass until noon and then from 7-8p. While I realize many may be at work during the day, I once again want to *invite* people to utilize this great devotion. Eucharistic Exposition is a Eucharistic devotion whereby members of a given parish gather to pray in adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament exposed in a monstrance (ornate display vessel). To see Jesus Christ visibly present under the appearance of the consecrated host is much more conducive to intimacy than hidden away in the tabernacle (even while both are acceptable). Visible Exposition permits us to faithfully fulfill the words of our Lord: "Indeed, this is the will of my heavenly Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son, and believes in Him, shall have eternal life. Him

I will raise up on the last day" (John 6:40). Imagine, being in the very presence of the Living, Saving, Loving Lord sacramentally present in the Eucharist. This is what we believe at each Mass. This is what we believe we do in the prolonged exposition of the Eucharist. It enables one to be intimately in God's presence for prayer, praise, adoration, instruction, and consolation.
