I have a small confession to make... I ate too much last Thursday on Thanksgiving. I suspect I'm not alone. While I've had moments of hunger, I've never truly been hungry or malnourished. I've never been unable to obtain needed food and sustenance. I've been... no, I <u>am</u> blessed. In this weekend's Gospel, we hear Jesus' teaching regarding the Final Judgment. There at the end of time, Jesus Christ the King will separation of the 'sheep' from the 'goats' – the sheep to the right and the goats to the left. The sheep will go off to eternal glory, while the goats, eternal punishment. And what is the criterion for judgment to be used by the Son of Man? One's personal treatment of Christ present in the poor and needy in body, mind, and spirit. Given that I just ate myself stuffed full and nearly sick, I'm left wondering about the hungry around me. Fortunately, it is no sin to have enough to eat (glutton may be another matter), but we must always be aware of our Christian duty to provide for the poor always with us.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: "God blesses those who come to the aid of the poor and rebukes those who turn away from them: 'Give to him who begs from you, do not refuse him who would borrow from you'; 'you received without pay, give without pay' (Mt 5:42; 10:8). It is by what they have done for the poor that Jesus Christ will recognize his chosen ones. When 'the poor have the good news preached to them,' it is the sign of Christ's presence (Mt 11:5; Cf. Lk 4:18). "The Church's love for the poor... is a part of her constant tradition." This love is inspired by the Gospel of the Beatitudes, the poverty of Jesus, and His concern for the poor. Love for the poor is even one of the motives for the duty of working so as to 'be able to give to those in need' (Cf. Eph 4:28). It extends not only to material poverty but also to the many forms of cultural and religious poverty." (*CCC* #2443-4).

Not only is giving assistance to the less fortunate important, but how we do so is as well. St John Chrysostom once said, "Helping a person in need is good in itself. But the degree of goodness is hugely affected by the attitude with which it is done. If you show resentment because you are helping the person out of a reluctant sense of duty, then the person may receive your help but may feel awkward and embarrassed. This is because he will feel beholden to you. If, on the other hand, you help the person in a spirit of joy, then the help will be received joyfully. The person will feel neither demeaned nor humiliated by your help, but rather will feel glad to
