

A PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

MESSAGE OF THE HOLY FATHER, POPE FRANCIS Lent 2022



Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up. So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all (Gal 6:9-10).

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Lent is a favorable time for personal and community renewal, as it leads us to the paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Sowing and Reaping. In these words, so dear to Jesus, St. Paul speaks to us of a *kairós*, an opportune time for sowing goodness in view of a future harvest. Lent is certainly such an opportune time, but so is our entire existence. All too often in our lives greed, pride and the desire to possess, accumulate and consume have the upper hand as we see from the story of the foolish man in the Gospel parable who thought his life was safe and secure because of the abundant grain and goods he had stored in his barns. Lent invites us to conversion, to a change in mindset, so that life's truth and beauty may be found not so much in possessing as in giving, not so much in accumulating as in sowing and sharing goodness.

The first to sow is God himself who with great generosity continues to sow abundant seeds of goodness in our human family. During Lent we are called to respond to God's gift by accepting his word which is living and active. Regular listening to the word of God makes us open and docile to his working and bears fruit in our lives. This brings us great joy, yet even more it summons us to become God's co-workers. By making good use of the present time we too can sow seeds of goodness. This call to sow goodness should not be seen as a burden but a grace whereby the Creator wishes us to be actively united with his own bountiful goodness.

What about the harvest? Do we not sow seeds in order to reap a harvest? Of course! St. Paul points to the close relationship between sowing and reaping when he says anyone who sows sparsely will reap sparsely as well, and anyone who sows generously will reap generously as well. But what kind of harvest are we talking about? A first fruit of the goodness we sow appears in ourselves and our daily lives, even in our little acts of kindness. In God no act of love, no matter how small, and no generous effort will ever be lost. Just as we recognize a tree by its fruits, so a life full of good deeds radiates light and carries the fragrance of Christ to the world. Serving God in freedom from sin brings forth fruits of sanctification for the salvation of all.

In truth we see only a small portion of the fruits of what we sow since, according to the Gospel proverb, one sows, while another reaps. When we sow for the benefit of others we share in God's own benevolent love: it is truly noble to place our hope in the hidden power of the seeds of goodness we sow and thus to initiate processes whose fruits will be reaped by others. Sowing goodness for the benefit of others frees us from narrow self-interest, infuses our actions with gratuitousness, and makes us part of the magnificent horizon of God's benevolent plan.

The word of God broadens and elevates our vision: it tells us that the real harvest is eschatological, the harvest of the last undying day. The mature fruit of our lives and actions is fruit for eternal life, our treasure in heaven. Jesus himself uses the image of the seed that dies in the ground in order to bear fruit as a symbol of the mystery of his death and resurrection while St. Paul uses the same image to speak of the resurrection of our bodies. What is sown is perishable, but what is raised is imperishable; what is sown is contemptible but what is raised is glorious; what is sown is weak, but what is raised is powerful; what is sown is a natural body, and what is raised is a spiritual body." The hope of resurrection is the great light that the risen Christ brings to the world, for if our hope in Christ has been for this life only, we are of all people the most pitiable. In fact, however, Christ has been raised from the dead, as the first-fruits of all who have fallen as leep. Those who are intimately united to him in love by dying a death like his will also be united to his resurrection for eternal life. Then the upright will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father.

Let us not grow tired of Doing Good. Christ's resurrection enlivens earthly hopes with the great hope of eternal life, planting the seed of salvation in our present time. Bitter disappointment at shattered dreams, deep concern for the challenges ahead and discouragement at the poverty of our resources, can make us tempted to seek refuge in self-centeredness and indifference to the suffering of others. Indeed, even our best resources have their limitations: Youths grow tired and weary, the young stumble and fall. Yet God gives

strength to the weary, strengthens the powerless. Those who hope in the Lord will regain their strength, they will soar on wings like eagles; though they run they will not grow weary, though they walk they will never tire. The Lenten season calls us to place our faith and hope in the Lord, since only if we fix our gaze on the risen Christ will we be able to respond to the Apostle's appeal let us never grow tired of doing good.

Let us not grow tired of praying! Jesus taught us to pray always without becoming weary. We need to pray because we need God. Thinking that we need nothing other than ourselves is a dangerous illusion. If the pandemic has heightened the awareness of our own personal and social fragility, may this Lent allow us to experience the consolation provided by faith in God without whom we cannot stand firm. No one attains salvation alone since we are all in the same boat amid the storms of history; and certainly no one reaches salvation without God, for only the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ triumphs over the dark waters of death. Faith does not spare us life's burdens and tribulations, but it does allow us to face them in union with God in Christ with the great hope that does not disappoint, whose pledge is the love that God has poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.

Let us not grow tired of uprooting evil from our lives! May the corporal fasting to which Lent calls us fortify our spirit for the battle against sin. Let us not grow tired of asking for forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, knowing that God never tires of forgiving. Let us not grow tired of fighting against concupiscence, that weakness which induces to selfishness and all evil and finds in the course of history a variety of ways to lure men and women into sin. One of these is addiction to the digital media which impoverishes human relationships. Lent is a propitious time to resist these temptations and to cultivate instead a more integral form of human communication made up of authentic encounters, face-to-face and in person.

Let us not grow tired of doing good in active charity towards our neighbors. During this Lent, may we practice almsgiving by giving joyfully. God who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food enables each of us not only to have food to eat, but also to be generous in doing good to others. While it is true that we have our entire life to sow goodness, let us take special advantage of this Lenten season to care for those close to us and to reach out to our brothers and sisters who lie wounded along the path of life. Lent is a favorable time to seek out – and not to avoid – those in need, to reach out – and not to ignore – those who need a sympathetic ear and a good word; to visit – and not to abandon – those who are lonely. Let us put into practice our call to do good to all and take time to love the poor and needy, those abandoned and rejected, those discriminated against and marginalized.

If we do not give up, we shall reap our harvest in due time. Each year during Lent we are reminded that goodness, together with love, justice and solidarity, are not achieved once and for all; they have to be realized each day. Let us ask God to give us the perseverance of the farmer and to persevere in doing good one step at a time. If we fall, let us stretch out our hand to the Father who always lifts us up. If we are lost, if we are misled by the enticements of the evil one, let us not hesitate to return to God who is generous in forgiving. In this season of conversion, sustained by God's grace and by the communion of the Church, let us not grow tired of doing good. The soil is prepared by fasting, watered by prayer, and enriched by charity. Let us believe firmly that if we do not give up we shall reap our harvest in due time and that, with the gift of perseverance, we shall obtain what was promised for our salvation and the salvation of others. By cultivating fraternal love towards everyone, we are united to Christ who gave his life for our sake and we are granted a foretaste of the joy of the kingdom of heaven when God will be all in all.

May the Virgin Mary, who bore the Savior in her womb and pondered all these things in her heart, obtain for us the gift of patience. May she accompany us with her maternal presence so that this season of conversion may bring forth fruits of eternal salvation.

Alive In Christ - Scholarship Details

In an effort to increase and retain enrollment of children in Catholic elementary schools, the "Alive in Christ" Scholarship Program seeks to provide financial assistance to those families (both Catholic and Non-Catholic) who wish to offer their children an education at a Catholic elementary school in the archdiocese. Scholarship awards are based upon financial need of the applicant and will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Applications of all income-eligible families with students attending eligible schools will be considered, regardless of faith. K-4 applications for new students will be given preference and existing students at any grade level are eligible to apply as well.

2022-2023 Alive in Christ Income Guidelines

Catholic Family Tuition Assistance (CFTA)

The people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis established this endowed fund through their contributions to the Returning God's Gifts campaign. This ten million dollar endowment was established in May, 1999. Grants are made on the basis of financial need as determined by the application process. Grants may be used for Catholic children in Catholic families to attend an archdiocesan or parochial elementary school or an archdiocesan or parochial high school. Annual income guidelines are not published because both income and annual expenses are considered in the award process. The 2022-23 application deadline is February 28th, 2022.

Applications will be considered for students of income-eligible Catholic families who would like to attend grades K-12 at any archdiocesan or parish school. Students who are new to the school and those who already attend will be considered.

Safe Environment

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone ministering to minors and vulnerable adults (clergy, employees and volunteers) in the Archdiocese are <u>required to register in the system and complete the steps outlined below.</u> This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. Those new to service must register in Prevent and Protect STL prior to employment or volunteering. Those currently in service must register in the Prevent and Protect STL in order to remain in compliance with Safe Environment.

All clergy, employees and volunteers must:

- Attend a Protecting God's Children workshop. Upcoming workshops can be found at: https://www.preventandprotectstl.org/s/stlouis/pgc.htm For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to the new system.
- 2. Register for an updated background screening. Screenings will automatically be updated every three months. There is a one-time \$8 fee for the screening. Payable online by credit card.
- 3. View two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct
- 4. Agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct
- 5. An online Protecting God's Children refresher will be required every three years.

The correct training record will be applied to your account by the Office of Child and Youth Protection.

User may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
