



Pastors Page Reflection

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The 6th grade teacher posed the following problem to her arithmetic classes: "A wealthy man dies and leaves ten million dollars. One-fifth is to go to his wife, one-fifth is to go to his son, one-sixth to his butler, and the rest to charity. Now, what does each get?" After a very long silence in the classroom, little Joey raised his hand. The teacher called on Joey for his answer. With complete sincerity in his voice, Joey answered, "A lawyer!" — He's probably right. Where there is a will, there is often a lawsuit. Someone in the crowd listening to Jesus said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." Jesus refused to take the case.

The readings for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time, encourage reflection on the direction of one's life and the focus of one's heart. They challenge individuals to look beyond earthly desires and concentrate on the eternal.

The first reading from Ecclesiastes states, "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" Qoheleth highlights the human experience of striving and accumulating, potentially finding it to be meaningless, as others may benefit from the gains. This emphasizes the temporary nature of earthly possessions and achievements when detached from God and eternal life.

This idea is echoed in the Gospel reading from Luke, where Jesus tells the parable of the rich fool. A wealthy farmer plans to build larger barns for his abundant harvest and enjoy many years of ease. However, God intervenes, stating, "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?" (Lk12:20). This serves as a reminder that earthly plans and possessions are temporary. The rich man's mistake wasn't his wealth, but his self-centeredness, failure to recognize God's blessings, and neglect of others. He was rich in worldly goods but poor in his relationship with God and neighbor.

Being "rich toward God" is central to today's message. It's not about rejecting all possessions, but cultivating detachment and recognizing them as God's gifts to be used wisely and shared. The second reading from Colossians reinforces this, urging individuals to "seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God". Through Baptism, people are united with Christ, called to abandon earthly desires like greed, which is idolatry. Chasing these things can replace God in people's hearts.

A Christ-centered life is encouraged, with a focus on heavenly matters rather than earthly ones. This means living generously, compassionately, and lovingly towards one's neighbor, thus accumulating treasures in heaven where they are safe.


We are invited to examine our values and where we place our trust. Are we focused on ourselves and possessions like the rich fool, or are we striving to be "rich toward God?" Are we generous with our time, talents, and resources, especially towards the needy?

Let us trust in God's providence and live generously, experiencing the joy of being faithful stewards. May God inspire us to be good servants who build heavenly treasure by sharing their gifts, prayers, forgiveness, and resources with those in need.


