



Pastors Page Reflection

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

There is a story told about a young man and an old preacher. The young man had lost his job and didn't know which way to turn. So, he went to see the old preacher. Pacing about the preacher's study, the young man ranted about his problem. Finally, he clenched his fist and shouted, "I've begged God to say something to help me. Tell me, Preacher, why doesn't God answer?" The old preacher, who sat across the room, spoke something in reply – something so hushed, it was indistinguishable. The young man stepped across the room. "What did you say?" he asked. The preacher repeated himself, but again in a tone as soft as a whisper. So, the young man moved closer until he was leaning on the preacher's chair. "Sorry," he said. "I still didn't hear you." With their heads bent together, the old preacher spoke once more. "God sometimes whispers," he said, "so that we will move closer to hear Him." This time the young man heard, and he understood. — We all want God's voice to thunder through the air with the answer to our problem. But God's is the still, small voice... the gentle whisper. Perhaps there's a reason. Nothing draws human focus quite like a whisper. God's whisper means I must stop my ranting and move close to Him, until my head is bent together with His. Then, as I listen, I will find my answer. Better still, I find myself closer to God.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus begins with a message of incredible comfort: "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32). What a beautiful and tender image! We are God's "little flock," and He desires to give us the greatest gift of all—His kingdom. This is not something we earn through our own efforts, but a gift freely given by a loving Father. This truth should banish all fear and fill our hearts with confidence.

But this gift of the kingdom comes with a corresponding call to a life of radical trust and detachment. Jesus tells us to "sell your belongings and give alms," and to provide for ourselves "money bags that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven" (Luke 12:33). This is not an anti-wealth message in itself, but a call to reorient our hearts. Jesus knows that where our treasure is, there our heart will be also. If our treasure is in earthly possessions, our hearts will be tied to this world, making it difficult to fully embrace the kingdom of God. But if our treasure is in heaven—in acts of love, mercy, and charity—our hearts will be fixed on what is eternal.

Then, Jesus gives the parable of the faithful and unfaithful steward. This part of the Gospel is a direct challenge to those of us who have been given much. Peter asks if these parables are for the apostles or for everyone, and Jesus' answer makes it clear that with greater knowledge and responsibility comes greater accountability. "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much" (Luke 12:48). We, as Catholics, have been entrusted with a great deal: the sacraments, the Word of God, the rich tradition of our faith. We are called to be faithful and prudent stewards of these gifts, using them to serve God and our neighbor, not for our own selfish gain or comfort.

My brothers and sisters, we are heirs to this great tradition of faith. We are called to live not as if this world is our permanent home, but as pilgrims on a journey toward our true homeland. This requires a faith like Abraham's—a faith that trusts in God's promises even when we cannot see the destination. It requires the detachment and generosity of the Gospel—a willingness to use our earthly resources to build up heavenly treasure.

Let us pray for the grace to be that faithful and watchful flock, trusting in God's good pleasure, and preparing our hearts to welcome Christ not just at the end of time, but in every moment of our lives.






