


### Mass of Remembrance-

On November 2<sup>nd</sup> at our 10 AM mass, we will have a Memorial Presentation in remembrance of our loved ones who have passed.

Families are invited to bring a framed 4x6 or 5x7 photo of their loved ones to be placed near the votive candles, where they will remain throughout the month of November, along with a list of those being remembered. On this day, a representative for the family will process into Mass with Father carrying a lit candle that will burn during mass and then be presented to the family member as the names of those being remembered are read aloud. Once all candles have been presented, Father will say a special prayer for the bereaved. All are encouraged to join us for this special liturgy of prayer and remembrance. Since this is our first year doing this, it is open to anyone who wants to honor a loved one, *(in the future this special presentation will be reserved for loved ones that have passed in the prior year.)*

There is a sign-up sheet in the lobby, please register so we can ensure that we have enough memorial candles for those who want to participate.

The Gospel passage of Luke 17:11-19 begins with the ten lepers crying out to Jesus, "Master! Have pity on us!" Jesus' response is a test of their faith: "Go and show yourselves to the priests."

**Faith in Action:** According to Mosaic Law, only the priests could declare a leper clean and allow them back into society. The lepers were healed as they were going, not before. Their healing was a direct reward for their obedience to Jesus' command and their faith that he had already acted, even before they saw the result.

**The Journey of Life:** This reminds us that our spiritual journey often requires us to take a step of faith before God reveals the next part of the path. We are called to obey the Lord's commands and the teachings of the Church, trusting that his grace is at work even before we perceive the visible blessing.

Only one of the ten, upon realizing he was healed, returned to Jesus. He was a Samaritan—a foreigner and outcast—who returned to glorify God and fall at Jesus' feet in thanks. All ten received physical cleansing, but the Samaritan received something more profound: Salvation. Jesus told him, "Your faith has saved you." This suggests that the Samaritan's physical cure led to a spiritual wholeness or salvation that the other nine missed.

A young father once told me he was trying to teach his kids gratitude. He asked his teenage son at the dinner table, "What are you thankful for today?" The son mumbled, "The microwave." "The microwave?" the father asked, confused. The son replied, "Yeah. I'm thankful it works so fast because I hate waiting for dinner." We treat God's grace like a microwave. We expect instant, easy blessings, and when we get them, we move on to the next task without a moment of deep, personal thanks. We forget the miracle of creation, the daily rising of the sun, the beating of our own heart. We take for granted the very things that are, in fact, undeserved gifts. We approach the sacraments, receive grace, and then rush out of the church parking lot, spiritually cleansed but socially preoccupied.

For Catholics, the Samaritan's action highlights the centrality of thanksgiving (*Eucharist* is Greek for "thanksgiving") in the Christian life. We are all given gifts and graces daily, but true discipleship requires us to stop, recognize the Giver, and return praise. Failing to give thanks means accepting the gift without acknowledging the relationship the giver.

We have all been cleansed of the leprosy of sin through Baptism, Confirmation, and Reconciliation. We are healed every week—every day—by God's countless graces.

Let us resolve today to be the one. To stop, turn back, and fall at the feet of Jesus Christ, especially here at the Altar. The Mass is our eternal "Thank You" to God, our Eucharist. It is here that we move from being merely healed recipients to whole, grateful disciples. May we always recognize the Giver above the gift, that our faith may not only cleanse us but truly save us.


