*4th Sunday in Ordinary Time*



A young man once entered a monastery, searching for holiness and peace. On his first day, the abbot handed him a broom and said, “Sweep the courtyard.” The young man did, day after day — under rain, heat, and wind. After months of sweeping, he finally approached the abbot in frustration: “Father, I came seeking God, but all I’ve done is sweep the dust!” The abbot smiled and asked, “What have you learned from the sweeping?” The young man paused, then said, “Joy comes not from success, but from doing even small things with love.” The abbot nodded: “Then you’ve begun to understand the Beatitudes.”

In today’s Gospel, Jesus goes up the mountain and teaches the crowd what we know as the Beatitudes — a new way of seeing life, a new definition of happiness. Jesus flips the world’s logic upside down. He tells us that real joy is not found in wealth, comfort, or status — but in hearts that resemble His.

“Blessed are the poor in spirit,” Jesus says. This isn’t about lacking money, but about knowing we always need God. The poor in spirit don’t boast of strength; they trust that everything good is a gift. “Blessed are those who mourn” — not because sorrow is good, but because those who grieve are open to compassion, and the God of all comfort draws near to them. “Blessed are the meek” — those who choose gentleness over aggression, patience over pride. In a noisy world, meekness is not weakness; it’s strength under control.

The Beatitudes continue like this — each one sketching the portrait of a heart that belongs to God: merciful, pure, peacemaking, willing to stand for what is right even when it costs something. It’s no coincidence that these aren’t just nice words; they describe Jesus Himself. He is poor in spirit, gentle and merciful, pure of heart, persecuted for righteousness. To follow Him means to walk this same path — a path that may look hard, but leads to deep peace.

Living the Beatitudes takes daily courage. It happens not only in grand choices but in quiet moments — choosing forgiveness over anger, kindness over judgment, humility over pride. Each small act of love shapes our hearts to look more like Christ’s. That’s holiness: not perfection, but love lived faithfully.

Maybe this week, we can choose one Beatitude and pray to live it more intentionally.

- Are we mourning? Ask for God’s comfort.
- Are we angry? Seek the peace of meekness.
- Are we tempted to judge? Practice mercy.

If we live even one of these blessings each day, we begin to see God’s kingdom grow — not far away, but right here among us.

When the young monk swept the courtyard, he discovered that holiness isn’t hidden in great deeds, but in ordinary moments lived with extraordinary love. That’s what Jesus promises in the Beatitudes — not comfort, but the joy of a heart that belongs to God. Wherever we are, if we love as Christ loves, we are indeed *blessed*.

**Grace Upon Grace: Understanding Indulgences Before  
Lent— A 4 Part Series— Part 2**



*4. Key Differences at a Glance*

*Plenary Indulgence*

Removes all temporal punishment

Requires confession, communion, prayers for Pope, and total detachment from sin

Can be gained once per day

Applied to self or souls in Purgatory

*Partial Indulgence*

Removes part of temporal punishment

Requires contrition and the indulgenced act

Can be gained many times a day

Applied to self or souls in Purgatory

*5. Who Can Receive Indulgences?*

To receive any indulgence, a person must:

- Be baptized
- Be in a state of grace (at least by completion of the indulgenced act)
- Have the intention of gaining the indulgence
- Perform the indulgenced work as prescribed

*6. Why the Church Teaches This Indulgences:*


- Emphasize God's mercy
- Encourage conversion and holiness
- Strengthen communion of saints
- Help souls in Purgatory

They are not a "shortcut to heaven," but a school of love, repentance, and trust in Christ.






