5th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Let it shine,

Let it shine,

Let it shine!

Matthew 5:13-16 "You are the light of the world"

We are so familiar with this phrase that I think it is easy for us to overlook just how central this statement is to who we are called to be as Christians. You see, this statement of Jesus was not a compliment he was bestowing upon His disciples. It was a purpose, a mission.

In our world today, where darkness seems to be so prevalent, it is essential for us to be the light that pushes back against the darkness, striving to reveal what is true, helping people find their way. To be light then, is to live our lives in a way that makes God's goodness unmistakably present in the world.

I was always fond of the motto of The Christophers. The organization was founded by Father James Keller in 1949. Their mission is "to encourage people...to use their God-given talents to make a positive difference in the world". They express this mission in their motto: "It is better to light one candle than to curse the darkness."

Light, by its very nature is giving of itself. A lamp is not lit to be admired, but to illuminate a room. In the same way, Jesus teaches that our good works are not meant to bring us acclaim or adulation but are meant to lead others to give glory to God.

Our mission to be light comes with responsibility. Light that is hidden or intentionally dimmed fails to fulfill its purpose. Fear, complacency, or a desire to just fit in with others, can tempt us to cover our light. Yet Jesus is very clear that our faith is never meant to be private or purely internal. In order for our lives to bear fruit for God, our faith must take shape in visible acts of charity and love; especially in those dark places where hope feels scarce.

To be the light of the world is to live so that, through us, others can catch a glimpse of God's presence and promise.

**Grace Upon Grace: Understanding Indulgences Before
Lent– A 4 Part Series– Part 3**



I. General Conditions (Required Every Time)

To gain any plenary indulgence, the faithful must fulfill all four conditions:

1. Sacramental Confession (Within about 20 days before or after the indulgenced work)
2. Eucharistic Communion (Preferably on the same day)
3. Prayer for the Intentions of the Pope (One Our Father and one Hail Mary are customary)

Complete detachment from all sin, even venial sin (*This is the most demanding condition*)

If any of these is lacking, the indulgence becomes partial, not plenary.

II. Indulgenced Works That Carry a Plenary Indulgence

1. Eucharist & Adoration

- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for at least 30 minutes
- Receiving the Papal Blessing (*Urbi et Orbi*) – even via radio, TV, or livestream

2. Sacred Scripture

Devout reading of Sacred Scripture for at least 30 minutes

3. Rosary

- Praying the Rosary:
 - In a church or chapel
 - In a family
 - In a religious community
- In a pious association (*Must be prayed vocally and meditatively*)

4. Stations of the Cross

- Making the Stations of the Cross:
 - Before stations legitimately erected
 - Meditating on the Passion of Christ
- Moving from station to station (movement may be omitted if prevented)

5. Divine Mercy

- Divine Mercy Sunday:
 - Participating in prayers and devotions in honor of Divine Mercy
 - Or praying the Our Father and Creed before the Blessed Sacrament
- With trust in Divine Mercy

6. Jubilee / Holy Year

Passing through a Holy Door during a Jubilee Year (With prayer, confession, and communion)

7. Retreats & Spiritual Exercises

Participation in spiritual exercises or retreats lasting at least 3 full days

8. First Sacraments & Ordinations

- Receiving First Holy Communion
- Celebrating a First Mass (for the priest)
- Attending a priestly ordination (for the faithful)


