### Tragedy of Sin and God's Loving Mercy

The consequence of sin is an act of separation from God—an alienation, that is, the separation of humankind not only from God but also from oneself, from other people, and from the world around the individual. A person's rupture with God leads tragically to divisions between brothers and sisters.

Every sin against the common good and its demands, in the whole broad area of rights and duties of citizens, is a social sin. Social sin is every sin committed against the justice due in relations between individuals, between the individual and the community, and between the community and the individual.

Through the sacrament of reconciliation, God has given us his great gift of mercy to forgive our sins and to reconcile us with him in his great love. Lent gives us that special time to reflect on our lives in all our brokenness and to consider how we can draw closer to God. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, a powerful outward symbol of interior repentance and spiritual awareness. Early Christians used ashes to show repentance as well, not only on Ash Wednesday. After going to confession, it was common for the priest to mark the person with ashes on their forehead.

The ashes placed on our foreheads are not meant to be merely symbolic, but transformative. They call us to acknowledge the ways sin fractures our relationship with God and with others, and to respond with genuine repentance. Through the sacrament of reconciliation and a renewed commitment to love, Lent becomes not only a season of reflection, but a path toward restoration and deeper communion with God.



**Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence in the Catholic Church.**

- **Fasting: Catholics aged 18–59 are permitted one full meal, with two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal.**
- **Abstinence from meat: Catholics aged 14 and older must abstain from eating meat.**

**Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and calls the faithful to repentance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.**

**8. First Sacraments & Ordinations**

- Receiving First Holy Communion
- Celebrating a First Mass (for the priest)
- Attending a priestly ordination (for the faithful)

**9. Profession of Faith & Religious Life**

- Renewal of baptismal promises:
  - At the Easter Vigil
  - On the anniversary of Baptism
- Religious profession (first or perpetual vows)

**10. Marian Devotions**

- Public recitation of the Rosary on:
  - October 7 (Our Lady of the Rosary)
  - Marian feasts, in a church or oratory
- Participation in a Marian procession

**11. Saints & Feast Days**

- Visiting a church or oratory on its titular feast, and praying:
  - Our Father
  - Creed

**12. For the Faithful Departed (Special Case)**

- Visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead:
  - November 1–8 → *Plenary indulgence each day*
- Visiting a church on All Souls' Day (Nov 2) and praying:
  - Our Father
  - Creed

*(Only applicable to souls in Purgatory)*

**13. At the Hour of Death**

- Plenary indulgence at the moment of death:
  - Granted by a priest with Apostolic Blessing
  - Or automatically if the dying person habitually prayed during life

**III. Important Notes**

- Only one plenary indulgence per day, except:
  - At the hour of death
- A plenary indulgence may be applied:
  - To oneself, or
  - To a soul in Purgatory
- Indulgences cannot be applied to living persons
