OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH - 2023 THEME: RADICAL SOLIDARITY

Every October the USCCB Pro-Life Secretariat introduces a new annual Respect Life theme. "Radical Solidarity" focuses on a culture that engages with people in their daily lives in both word and deed by walking with them amid their suffering. The first weekend in October is considered Respect Life Weekend. Some parishes choose to focus on the theme for the year at that time, while other parishes will also focus on a variety of topics pertaining to a culture of life each weekend of the month. Looking forward, in November we will also be encouraging our youth from grades 5 through 12 to write an essay reflecting on what radical solidarity means to them, and how they might practice radical solidarity in their own lives.



By now all parishes should have received the USCCB Pro Life Secretariat Respect Life packets. These packets contain a poster, prayer cards, and a cover letter from Bishop Burbidge, Chair of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities. Parishes are also able to access items digitally with additional items including bulletin inserts, homily helps, graphics, as well as Respect Life Month novena, action guide, and Bishop Burbidge's statement. 

PARISH BULLETIN ANNOUNCEMENT | ANUNCIO DEL BOLETÍN PARROQUIAL

Pastors, parochial administrators, parish life coordinators, and parish directors are reminded that the following notice should be published quarterly in parish bulletins. "The Catholic Church is working diligently to prevent sexual abuse by parish employees, volunteers, deacons, and priests. If you have been sexually abused by someone associated with the Church and would like to report or discuss the experience, we urge you to contact: Kathy Drinkwine 715-718-1110. The Diocese of Superior welcomes your call and understands how difficult it may be to reach out in this situation. The phone number provided is confidential and dedicated solely to these calls. Know that your call will be treated with respect, dignity, and compassion. The Diocese of Superior is bound by civil and canon law to report sexual abuse of a minor to civil authorities. Anyone who believes that they have been sexually abused is strongly encouraged to report as well."

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS (All Saint's Day) | Wednesday, November 1, 2023 AND

THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (All Soul's Day) | Thursday, November 2, 2023

In 2023, November 1 falls on a Wednesday and so All Saints' Day is celebrated as a holy day of obligation in the dioceses of the United States. On the following day, Thursday, November 2, All Souls' Day is celebrated. The readings for Mass on All Souls' Day need to be selected beforehand from among those found at Lectionary nos. 668 (The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed) or 1011 – 1016 (Masses for the Dead).

THANKSGIVING DAY | Thursday, November 23, 2023

In the Diocese of Superior, Thanksgiving Day has been chosen as one of our four Special Days of Prayer and focuses on gratitude for the harvest and the fruits of the earth. Proper orations and a preface for Mass on this day are found in the Missal at Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, either its no. 28 (After the Harvest) or no. 49 (For Giving Thanks to God) along with their suggested prefaces. Options for scripture readings are found in Volume IV of the Lectionary (nos. 943-947—In Thanksgiving to God).

The Book of Blessings provides an Order for the Blessing of Food for Thanksgiving Day (nos. 1755-1780) which may be incorporated within Mass or within a celebration of the Word. Parishes may also wish to take up a special collection of food items for their local food shelf.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION | Friday, December 8, 2023

Because December 8th does not fall on Sunday this year, Immaculate Conception is celebrated as a holy day of obligation. Unlike other holy days which are not celebrated as such when they fall on Saturday or Monday, Immaculate Conception always is. Only when December 8 falls on a Sunday—of Advent—(necessitating its move to December 9) that the celebration loses its obligatory nature.

OBLIGATORY BACK-TO-BACK CELEBRATIONS OF THE 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS DAY | Sunday-Monday, December 24-25, 2023

These two obligatory celebrations fall on consecutive days in 2023. When a Sunday and another holy day of obligation occur on two successive days, attendance at a single Mass during the span of the two days does not fulfill the double obligation. Two distinct Masses must be attended within the two 24-hour periods, or separately anticipated.

In 2023 December 25 (Christmas- a holy day of obligation) falls on Monday. Unlike other holy days falling on Saturday or Monday which lose their obligatory nature, Christmas is always a holy day of obligation. As is true with all Sundays, the faithful are obligated to attend Mass on the 4th Sunday of Advent as well—either on that day or anticipated the evening before, as usual. Again, one Mass cannot fulfill both obligations.

Back-to-back days of obligation may challenge our ability to provide the number of parish Masses usually expected. Eliminating opportunities for Mass attendance on either day is problematic. Hopefully, though, cooperative dialogue between clustered parishes will consider the health and well-being of priests along with the needs and expectations of parishioners.

SOLMNITY OF MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD | Monday, January 1, 2024

Because January 1 falls on Monday in 2024, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted.

LITURGY TRAINING PUBLICATIONS MATERIALS NOW AVAILBE AT A 35% DISCOUNT
