

FACULTY TO CONFIRM

The question of who possesses faculties to confirm can be confusing (Canon 883).

By the law itself, a priest may lawfully confirm in virtue of office or mandate when:


- He baptizes an adult.
- He receives a previously baptized non-Catholic into full communion.
- He readmits into full communion a previously baptized Catholic who apostatized from the faith.
- He readmits into full communion a previously baptized Catholic who through no personal fault was instructed in or adhered to a non-Catholic religion.
- He confirms a baptized Catholic in danger of death.

A priest must, however, request the faculty to confirm a baptized Catholic if this person:

- Was baptized (Catholic) before the use of reason and un-catechized.
- Never belonged to another church.
- Never apostatized from the faith.
- Never left the church.

In the situations stated, the priest must request in writing, the faculty to confirm from Bishop James Powers to facilitate the above process. EUCCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE - THE MARIAN ROUTE (NORTH)

May 21-22, 2024

Duluth Cathedral of Our Lady of the Rosary, Duluth, MN
Dioceses of Duluth and Superior



Throughout the National Eucharistic Revival, local communities are gathering momentum in response to God's invitation for renewal, calling on the Holy Spirit to bring the flame.

In keeping with this vision, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will accompany Jesus from city to city along four separate routes across the country, lighting hearts on fire along the way. Then, at the National Eucharistic Congress in July 2024, all these flames will join and blaze together.


Departing from the headwaters of the Mississippi at Lake Itasca, MN, the northern Marian route of the Pilgrimage will descend through the midwestern United States, pass through Wisconsin and Illinois, and meet up with the other three pilgrimage routes at the Congress in Indianapolis. Pilgrims will attend Mass every day of their journey, along with regular evenings of reflection and adoration. As they travel, pilgrims will grow closer to Our Lord through service to local communities, inviting the most marginalized among us to be revived by the Real Presence of Jesus Christ.


Thirteen dioceses will be all along the Marian Route, with the Diocese of Superior and Diocese of Duluth participating together beginning May 21st with Superior Bishop Powers leading adoration at the Duluth Cathedral of Our Lady of the Rosary, as well as joining Duluth Bishop Felton in leading the procession on May 22. A flyer will be available soon for you to share with your faithful.

The faithful of our Diocese are highly encouraged to participate in this historic journey by attending the Pilgrimage in a procession nearest them. Please share this information with parishioners and others in your community.



SYNOD INTERIM PHASE

There have been questions regarding what our Diocese is doing regarding the interim phase of the Synod. Small groups have been asked to answer the two questions of the Synod. A summary of these small group meetings will be summarized and sent to the USCCB by April 8. Because the two required questions are very similar in style to what will be discussed at our March deanery meetings, we will use those discussions as well to put together the summary. Representatives from these types of groups have been asked to convene small groups to discuss the questions regarding Respect Life, Lay Leaders, Hispanic Ministry/Migrants, Catholic Charities/Social Justice, Schools, Health Care, Campus Ministry. If anyone in the parishes would like to convene a small group to discuss the questions, Peggy Schoenfuss (pschoenfuss@catholicdos.org) would need discussion notes BEFORE Easter.

The two questions are:

- How can the structures and organization of the Church help all the baptized to respond to the call to proclaim the Gospel and to live as a community of love and mercy in Christ?
- Where have I seen or experienced successes – and distresses – within the Church's structure(s)/organization/leadership that encourage or hinder the mission?


STATUS ANIMARUM QUESTIONNAIRES (SAQ) HAVE BEEN SENT






SESSION III: "Marriage and Family: The Domestic Church"

Rules on General Absolution

Pastors are reminded that use of General Absolution (or "Form III") of the Sacrament of Reconciliation is forbidden except in cases of grave necessity as defined by Canon Law and the Apostolic Letter *Misericordia Dei*. This form of the Sacrament may not be celebrated without explicit permission from Bishop James Powers.



HOLY THURSDAY FOOT WASHING PRACTICES - MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER | Thursday, March 28, 2024

In 2016, to show the full meaning of foot washing at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, Pope Francis modified the rubric at #11 in the Roman Missal to say, "Those chosen from among the People of God, including men/women, young/old, healthy/sick, clerics, consecrated persons and laypeople." While this change primarily serves to reinforce existing liturgical practices in the diocese, pastors are reminded to "...instruct adequately both the chosen faithful and others, so all may participate in the rite consciously, actively and fruitfully."

EASTER VIGIL | Saturday, March 30, 2024

45 minutes after sunset


This year, the celebration of the Easter Vigil occurs on Saturday, March 30, 2024. In order to ensure sufficient darkness, at least 45 minutes (preferably one hour) should elapse after sunset; before the Vigil may begin.

The **following sample** is the listing of the time of sunset in key parishes in our Diocese (from East to West), and the earliest allowable start times the Easter Vigil should begin there. Parishes to the North and South of these locations would use similar times.


LITURGY TRAINING PUBLICATIONS MATERIALS NOW AVAILABLE AT A 35% DISCOUNT




CONFIRMATION RETREAT | MARCH 16-17, 2024


