

TIPS TO SUCCESS



PREPARE FOR SUCCESS

Be Prepared: Before launching your Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) efforts, take time to thoroughly review the Parish Leadership Manual and the accompanying samples. These resources are designed to equip you with everything you need. If you have any questions about the many ministries and programs supported by the CSA, don't hesitate to reach out! You can call the CSA Office at (715) 394–0223 or email starnowskiecatholicdos.org.

Start Early: Give your parishioners the gift of time! A minimum two-week advance notice is essential for them to prayerfully consider their pledge. Make sure your preparations are visible and consistent. This means utilizing bulletin announcements, heartfelt pulpit announcements, meaningful Prayers of the Faithful, and prominent posters in the weeks leading up to the appeal.

Be Enthusiastic: Let your passion shine through! Make the success of your parish's Catholic Services Appeal a personal goal. Your positive energy is infectious and will inspire others.

FOCUS ON IMPACT

Engage Major Donors: Major donors are absolutely vital to the success of the annual Catholic Services Appeal. Their capacity for substantial contributions, their leadership and influence within our community – think of families who have supported our diocese for generations, their role in fostering stewardship, and their potential for long-term sustainability are invaluable. By effectively engaging major donors, we can significantly enhance the impact of the CSA, benefiting our entire community.

Cultivate a Positive Image: Always speak and publish only positive things about the Catholic Services Appeal and the many programs it supports. This appeal provides critical services to more than 21,000 Catholic households across the 16 counties our Diocese serves. From supporting our Catholic school's management to funding vocations, the CSA makes a tangible difference. A positive attitude toward the appeal is truly contagious!


Connect Lives to Ministries: Help parishioners see the direct connection between their lives and the ministries supported by the Catholic Services Appeal. Show them how these programs enrich their lives and the lives of their neighbors.

EMPOWER PARTICIPATION

Strive for 100% Participation: Emphasize that every person is asked to respond to the appeal. It's crucial that everyone feels encouraged to pledge something, no matter the size of the gift. Remind them: no gift is too small! Every dollar adds up, and every act of giving strengthens our Church.

Show Gifts Make a Difference: Help people understand that their giving strengthens the Church and contributes to the well-being of countless individuals. Reiterate with local examples!

Seminarians, Deacons, OCIA Program? These personal stories illustrate the profound impact of their generosity.



MAXIMIZE CAMPAIGN MATERIALS

Utilize Campaign Materials: Don't go it alone! Name a Campaign Chair and build a dedicated team. Equip yourselves with the essential tools: the Leadership Manual, Pledge Envelopes, Posters, Bulletin Announcements, powerful Pulpit Announcements, and heartfelt Prayers of the Faithful. These resources are designed to make your campaign seamless and successful.

Ensure Ample Pledge Envelopes: Make it easy for parishioners to give! Have plenty of Pledge Envelopes readily available in the pews and stapled to bulletins. Demonstrate Pledge Envelope Completion: From the pulpit, take the time to demonstrate how to complete a Pledge Envelope. Don't rush this crucial step. Clear instructions will ensure accuracy and encourage participation.

Collect Pledges Thoughtfully: Collect the Pledge Envelopes before the Offertory. Then, bring them forward to the altar as a part of the Offertory procession. This symbolic act powerfully recognizes that this pledge to the Catholic Services Appeal is a sacred gift to God and His Church.

Display Parish Progress Prominently: Keep the momentum going by prominently displaying your parish's progress toward both the dollar and donor goals. This visibility inspires collective effort. Remember, you can call the CSA office anytime for a current update on your parish's standing.

FOSTER LASTING CONNECTIONS

Conduct a Comprehensive Follow-Up: The appeal doesn't end on Pledge Sunday! Continue to offer opportunities for parishioners to make pledges to the Catholic Services Appeal. We strongly advise all pastors to personally reach out to major donors. These "personal" connections are more essential than ever for the Appeal's success. Additionally, send a follow-up letter to parishioners who have not yet contributed. Persistence is key; don't lose hope in engaging them.

The CSA plays a pivotal role in providing the annual funding necessary for sustaining the programs, services, and ministries vital to the strength of our parishes right here in the Diocese of Superior. From supporting our seminarians who will lead future generations to funding critical outreach programs like those at Catholic Charities Bureau, your parish's participation in the CSA directly impacts our shared mission.

As members of the "One Holy and Apostolic Church," our participation in the CSA is integral to our collective identity as a broader Catholic Community. Together, let us continue to uphold our commitment to supporting the mission and vitality of our faith community through the Catholic Services Appeal.



ADVANCED NOTICE WEEKEND

Promoting the Catholic Services Appeal during Advance Notice Weekend will increase your chances for a successful campaign. The following steps should now be in place for the beginning of your CSA campaign:

- 1. By this time, the Catholic Services Appeal office has mailed Catholic Services Appeal supply packages to parishes and Catholic Services Appeal brochures with envelopes to all households listed in the Catholic Services Appeal database.
- 2. Display Catholic Services Appeal posters at all Church and school entrances.
- 3. An announcement to prepare parishioners for Commitment Weekend appears in the parish bulletin. Please consider using the bulletin inserts provided that coincide with the needs of your parish.
- 4. Catholic Services Appeal advertisements begin running in the Catholic Herald.
- 5. Use petitions to invite parishioners to pray for the success of the Appeal (samples in manual).
- 6. Use homilies and special announcements to prepare parishioners to make a gift or pledge on Commitment Weekend.
- 7. Catholic Services Appeal pledge envelopes ready for use by parish staff or volunteers who will be transferring gift information on them from commitment envelopes.
- 8. Staff and volunteers have been "briefed" to answer questions and address concerns about the Appeal.
- 9. Pulpit announcers and ushers have been scheduled as needed.
- 10. Bulletin inserts and announcements have been created to let parishioners know what the parish raised for the Catholic Services Appeal and what the parish's goal is.



COMMITMENT WEEKEND IN-PEW

Please follow the steps below to help promote a successful Commitment Weekend for your Catholic Services Appeal campaign:

- 1. Your announcement for Commitment Weekend should appear in the parish bulletin. Please consider using bulletin inserts provided in this manual that coincide with the needs of your parish.
- 2. Place an adequate supply of Catholic Services Appeal commitment envelopes in all pews before each Mass.
- 3. Make an announcement of Commitment Weekend from the pulpit.
- 4. Show the Video Presentation
- 5. Present the homily on the Catholic Services Appeal and what it means for the parish, pastor, or chairperson to speak about the Catholic Services Appeal at the end of the homily.
- 6. After the homily, guide parishioners through the signing/commitment process
- 7. Ushers collect commitment envelopes. Some people may want to give the following week as they consider their gift.
- 8. Petitions invite parishioners to pray for the success of the Catholic Services Appeal (sample petitions are available in this manual). Thank the parishioners for their generosity!



FOLLOW-UP PHASE

Your parish has held its Commitment Weekend. Now, a strong "Follow-Up" phase can help you meet or exceed your goal. Repeating your message will help your parish reach more families and secure more gifts. (August/September through November):

- 1. Appeal posters should be on display throughout the Follow-Up phase of your parish campaign
- 2. Pews should be supplied with commitment envelopes until the goal is reached
- 3. A majority of parishes indicated that a direct mailing to parishioners sent from the parish helps to increase the number of gifts raised. (Sample letters are included in this manual).
- 4. Even if your parish does send out a letter consider using a calling program or "phone-a-thon" to make a stronger impression with donors. Have council members and/or other parish leaders each make a number of calls (ten is a good amount).
- 5. Recruit volunteers for phone-a-thon
- 6. Locate a phone-a-thon site, and make sure volunteers with supporting information are ready.
- 7. Consider arranging a table at the back of the Church to answer questions about the Catholic Services Appeal and make extra brochures available.
- 8. During Masses and in the bulletin, include updated Catholic Services Appeal numbers, nearness to goal, and the number of families participating.
- 9. Pledge envelopes from donors who have made gifts should be mailed to the Catholic Services Appeal office for processing using the postage-paid business reply envelope.
- 10. Additional report forms are supplied in this manual to report Appeal gifts.



WRAP-UP PHASE

CSA OFFICE SUPPORT

- 1. Continue sending pledge envelopes to the Catholic Services Appeal Office for processing throughout the year until the goal is realized.
- 2. Pledge reminder statement mailings begin in October.
- 3. A follow-up letter from the CSA Office will be sent to all those who have not contributed during Advent and Lent, as well as weekly email messages.

What You'll Receive

- Parish Roster (printed or PDF)
 - Contains Constituent ID information and an interactive "Pledged/Paid" checkbox.
- Label Sheets
 - For parish follow-up mailings only.
- Excel Gift Reporting Form
 - To record all CSA pledges and payments.

How to Handle Follow-Up Mailings

- Use the Parish Roster to find anyone with an unchecked "Pledged/Paid" box.
- Use stickers from the sticker sheet to address follow-up letters or envelopes for these donors.
- Always rely on the Roster to determine who needs a follow-up.

How to Process Gifts and Payments

- Locate the donor in your Parish Roster.
- Check the "Pledged/Paid?" box if applicable.
- Record the pledge/payment amount and Constituent ID (or name) in the Excel Gift Reporting Form.

Helpful Tips

- Labels are only for parish follow-up mailings.
- Use the Roster as your main tool for tracking gifts and responses.
- In the digital Roster, press CTRL+F to quickly search for names.

FOLLOW-UP AND LABLES

*Using Two Across Labels to Track Gifts If Not Using New Excel Process

The left label is called the "control" label while the right label is called the "follow-up" label (see example below). Simply apply the control label from the left row for each parishioner who returned an envelope and affix it to the "SUGGESTED PLEDGES" area on the **LOWER LEFT** of the inside of the envelope.

Is there an address change? Be sure the label and what the parishioner wrote agree. If they do not agree, make the change on the label.

Keep the handwritten name visible. For envelopes with names not on pre-printed labels (e.g. visitors or new parishioners), write your parish number above the "SUGGESTED PLEDGES." Only use the control label on the envelopes.

Please ensure that the names and addresses are legible and complete including PO Box numbers and RRs on every envelope so that each donor can be given proper credit. Use the remaining Label for follow-up.

Follow the procedure of always taking the label from the left row for all envelopes received from parishioners (whether they indicate contributions or refusals). In other words, the left row of labels is used when either the person has contacted you or you have contacted them.

Labels remaining in the left row will indicate those who have yet to respond. The right-hand label should be used for mailing, either your mail campaign or mail follow-up.

You will want to mail a letter from the pastor along with a blank envelope informing parishioners how the gifts are to be returned.

As pledge envelopes are received with responses to the mailing, process them as described above. The left label, also known as the control label, can be used for telephone follow-up.

ACCOUNTING

GIFTS PROCESSING

The Diocese is responsible for all gift processing including donations made online and when the donor indicates on their envelope that they would like to make a gift with a credit card, debit card or electronic fund transfer. The diocese will process these types of gifts and update parishes via monthly reports that help track the fulfillment of these gifts.

Please be sure to deposit donations immediately. Envelopes received by the parish that request credit card, debit card, or electronic fund transfer should be mailed to the Diocese immediately to ensure timely processing.

As donation checks and cash are deposited in the parish CSA bank account, the parish will then mail "one" check reflecting the total gifts to the Appeal Office with the transmittal form. This should occur at the very least on a monthly basis, but weekly for the first few weeks.

It is important that the parish take proper steps in receiving donations as to the donor's wishes. For example: if a parish uses funds from a second collection, the total and exact purpose of the collection should be made clear to the congregation members. Likewise, it is not a good practice to use a percentage of the normal offertory to pay the parish goal unless the purpose is made transparent to the congregation.

Make sure to use Account #2175 to take in CSA gifts and Account #6501 to pay out funds to the Diocese. If you have questions regarding standard accounting practices please contact Alivia Olson, Accountant II at 715–394–0218 or email: mheiman@catholicdos.org.



PLEDGE REMINDERS

People have good intentions, but in order to fulfill obligations Pledge Reminders will be mailed out the first of each month until the point the pledge is fully paid.

Pledging and the payment of pledges sometimes require special reminders to inform and educate parishioners on the importance of paying their monthly pledge payments. A monthly Bulletin Announcement at the beginning of each month reminding parishioners of the importance of paying their pledges will help.

In addition, having a respected member of the parish make a brief Pulpit Announcement each month on the same weekend that the Bulletin Announcement is published, can make a big difference.

ONLINE GIVING

Online giving provides donors with a seamless, secure and easy way to make a gift to the Catholic Services Appeal. Your parish is automatically credited with your gift. Please include the Catholic Services Appeal website in your bulletin and in all your campaign correspondence with prospective donors www.catholicdos.org.

The Appeal does not end when the in-pew processes are over. If your parish has not reached its CSA goal, follow-up assistance and special mailings may be needed. Sometimes something as simple as a monthly Bulletin Announcement and a Pulpit Announcement may be enough to remind those who have not yet given to do so.

FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

Follow-up contact with those parishioners who have not responded is essential to achieving maximum results in your parish and can be done by telephone or mail.

TELEPHONE FOLLOW-UP

Telephone follow-up is by far the most effective method of reaching parishioners who have not responded because it offers the opportunity for personal contact, providing nearly all the advantages of face-to-face communication (or voice-to-voice in this case)! You will be filling out a pledge envelope for them according to what they pledge over the phone.

The procedure for telephone follow-up is as follows:

- 1) Recruit as many volunteers as possible early in the campaign. The more volunteers, the more successful your efforts will be. The parish councils and groups, each taking a few names, help make follow-up easy.
- 2) Arrange to have an office or area with several telephone lines available. Otherwise, volunteers can make calls from their homes.
- 3) Volunteers should only need to take between 10 to 15 calls and those calls should be done within a 3 to 5 day period.

Many parishes ask parish leaders and committee members to each make 10 - 15 calls.

4) Read the CSA brochure to become familiar with the CSA programs, services, and ministries.

MAIL FOLLOW-UP

There are advantages and disadvantages to this method. The advantages are that mail follow-up provides total parish coverage, and there is a minimal amount of effort. The disadvantages are that a total parish response is hard to achieve (even well-intentioned parishioners forget to return the mailed pledge envelope), and a lower dollar gift average is returned. However, it is better to try for some responses than not to try at all.

Mail follow-up should begin after the Catholic Services Appeal follow-up Weekend. A pledge envelope should be folded into a parish mailing envelope with the suggested follow-up letter from the pastor. A sample follow-up letter can be found in this packet. Continue follow-up until the goal has been achieved.

Remember...no gift is too small. Strive to reach 100% participation. \$5 is better than nothing.



TRANSMITTAL REPORT

The TRANSMITTAL REPORT is to be used every time you send in batches of pledge envelopes.



- 1) Enter the date the report is filled out.
- 2) Enter the transmittal number (1 for the first report, 2 for the second, etc.)
- 3, 4, 5) Enter your parish name, your parish number, and address to ensure proper credit.
- 6) TOTAL NUMBER OF ENVELOPES REPORTED: Enter the total number (count) of all envelopes reported. This includes both pledges and refusals.

TOTAL GIFTS: Enter the total dollar amount pledged, regardless of the amount paid.

NOW PAYING: Enter the total dollar amount of all cash and cash received with all the envelopes in this report.

- 7) On the first report, omit this line. On subsequent reports, the total from the previous report(s) should be entered here.
- 8) This is the total of lines 6 and 7.
- 9) Have your pastor/parish director sign the transmittal.

Include the original hard copy and the white copy of the transmittal with the pledge envelopes and parish check when you mail it to the Chancery. Retain the yellow copy for your records.

The CSA Office processes the parish checks and then sends reminders to parishioners about their pledges, electronic fund transfers, and credit card authorizations that will be processed by the Diocese.

Note: Do not use Transmittal for personal donor checks. They are for parish checks only.

MATCHING GIFTS

WHAT IS A MATCHING GIFT PROGRAM?

Many companies allow their employees to direct their charitable giving programs through matching gifts. When an employee notifies the company that they have made a charitable donation, the company will make a gift of the same amount, and in some cases double the amount, to the same charitable organization.

Matching Gift Programs are a wonderful way for employees to make their charitable dollars stretch farther at no cost to themselves. Donors simply ask their company's human resources office for a matching gift form, and we will do the rest!

It is extremely easy to process. Gift matching procedures can vary from company to company. The following example is typical:

A. An employee/retiree obtains a matching gift form from the employer, usually from the human resource department or company website.

B. After completing the form, the employee/retiree sends it along with the donation to the Diocese of Superior.

C. The Diocese certifies on the form that it has received the gift and meets the company's guidelines for receiving a matching gift.

D. The Diocese returns the form to the company.

E. The company verifies the eligibility of the employees/retirees and the Diocese recipient and sends the check to the Diocese.
