Getting Started this Lent



Let go of a bad habit.

What would you list as a bad habit? Pick a bad habit and try a day at a time, to let it go. Jesus came to free the prisoners. If you feel like a prisoner to a bad habit, take advantage of Lent to loosen its grip on you.

Strengthen a good habit.

Take a minute to write down three skills that you're good at: keeping a sense of humor, staying calm when everyone else is flying off the handle, taking care of the daily details, seeing the big picture, to name some examples. Pick one and think of how you can put this strength to good use on a daily basis. Healthy living is contagious. Exercising your strengths can also benefit those you live and spend time with.

Ask God to lead you.

Every morning, first thing, ask God to help you be a better person. Even when you're worried about a difficult situation, try to think ahead to that situation and picture God already there. This helps to weaken fear while allowing room for love to grow.

A small change over time can add up to big life changes in the long run. Lent provides for that opportunity. Practice Lent right where you are. It's where God is waiting for you.

Miraculous Healings of Jesus Mark 1:40-45

Mark's Gospel today begins with Jesus healing a man with leprosy, a disfiguring, infectious skin disease. In 1873, the cause of leprosy, also known as Hansen's disease, was identified as a bacterial infection. Modern studies have shown transmission is more difficult than previously thought. Since the 1940s, medical treatments have been available and patients no longer need to isolate once treatment has begun.

In Jesus's time, religious and social taboos dictated the behavior of those with leprosy and other skin diseases. The Law of Moses provided for the examination of skin diseases by the priests. If leprosy was identified the person was declared unclean. People with leprosy lived in isolation. If the sores healed, the Law of Moses provided a purification rite for the person to return to the community.

In this Gospel, the man with leprosy approached Jesus and asked for healing. He violated religious customs by approaching a clean person. His request to Jesus could be seen as courageous and daring. His words can also be read as challenging Jesus; asking how far Jesus would go to heal someone. Jesus touched the man, violating social norms. This is a sign of the depth of Jesus's compassion and also a statement about Jesus's interpretation of the Law of Moses.

Although Jesus touched the man, He did not break completely with the Law of Moses. Jesus instructed the man not to tell anyone about the cure and told him to go to the priests as prescribed by the Law. Jesus's second instruction honors the Law of Moses.

Mark's Gospel reports that after this healing, it became difficult for Jesus to travel freely. There are several possible explanations. There might have been concern about the repercussions of Jesus's breach of social and religious norms. In touching the man with leprosy, Jesus made Himself unclean. Mark's narrative though, leads to the conclusion that Jesus's movement was hampered by His popularity. Despite His instructions, the cured man spread the word about Jesus's healing power. (Though it's hard to blame the man for this!) People then sought Jesus out in search of His healing.

Book Review: The Cries of Jesus From the Cross

by Archbishop Fulton Sheen Sophia Institute Press

This book comprises an anthology of the writings of Bishop Sheen from 1933 through 1945. DO NOT be put off by the dates of the texts in the book. Not only will this probably be the best book you read this year, but you will keep it as a reference for many years to come. It is not a short book and may be best utilized as a daily "devotional" reader.

The book description says, "As death approaches, the human heart speaks its greatest words of love to those it holds most dear. So it is with Jesus, who in His final hours gave us seven last 'words,' rich in spiritual meaning for every human soul. Sheen shows how the seven words are, in fact, a full catechism of the spiritual life."

With Archbishop Sheen as your guide you'll learn:

- •Why, during His Passion, Jesus never proclaimed His innocence.
- •Why Jesus appealed to His father to forgive the crowd, but did not Himself forgive directly.
- •Why darkness covered the earth after Jesus spoke His fourth word.
- •How envy becomes the denial of all justice and love.
- •How the conversion of the good thief is the key to the conversion of our modern world.

Sheen discusses Jesus' cry, "I thirst" and writes: Human worth can be judged by human desires. Tell me your hungers and your thirsts, and I will tell you what you are. Do you hunger for money more than mercy, for riches more than for virtue, and for power more than service? Then you are selfish, pampered, and proud. Do you thirst for the wine of everlasting life more than for pleasure, and for the poor more than for the favor of the rich, and for souls more than for the first place at the table? Then you are a humble Christian.


