

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER PAVINO

A rich man had everything in life. Yet he wanted to know about the formula of true happiness. He went around the world searching for it. Finally, he met a Chinese wise man. When asked about the formula of true happiness, the wise man said, "Grandfather dies, father dies, son dies, grandson dies." The rich man was angry: "What kind of formula is that? How can it give happiness when everything you said was all about dying?" The wise man patiently explained: "You see, everybody dies. And the normal sequence is the older one dies ahead of the younger ones. You would not like to bury your son or grandson. That will surely make you unhappy."

This makes some sense. But basing one's happiness on death is very unfortunate. As Christians, however, we know that death does not have the final say. This is what the celebration of the Solemnity of the Ascension of our Lord is telling us. Our destiny as God's children does not end up in death. Rather, as followers of Jesus, we will share in his glory. As the Preface of this Mass beautifully puts it: "Christ... has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope. Christ is the beginning, the head of the Church; where he has gone, we hope to follow."

We are all destined for heaven and there are two requirements for us to get to heaven: First, we have to leave this world. And that means we have to die. We cannot go to heaven if we do not want to let go of this world. We cannot have both heaven and this world. Yet, so many people do not get it. They want to go to heaven, but they strongly resist death. Detachment, therefore, from this world is a necessary condition for reaching heaven.

And the second requirement is that we must be like Jesus. We cannot claim to be followers of Jesus, and thereby sharers in his glory, if we do not follow his teachings and imitate his example. That was the exhortation of St. Paul to the Ephesians: "You should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth." (Eph 4: 22-24).

In short, going to heaven is not only a matter of dying but also of living. We have to die to this world. But we must also live Christ's teachings, to the point that we can say like St. Paul, "Yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me" (Gal 2:20).

La resurrección, la ascensión y pentecostés son aspectos diversos del misterio pascual. Si se presentan como momentos distintos y se celebran como tales en la liturgia es para poner de relieve el rico contenido que hay en el hecho de pasar Cristo de este mundo al Padre. La resurrección subraya la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte, la ascensión su retorno al Padre y la toma de posesión del reino y pentecostés, su nueva forma de presencia en la historia. La Ascensión no es más que una consecuencia de la resurrección, hasta tal punto que la resurrección es la verdadera y real entrada de Jesús en la gloria. Mediante la resurrección Cristo entra definitivamente en la gloria del Padre.

En la Ascensión no se da una partida, que da lugar a una despedida; es una desaparición, que da lugar a una presencia distinta. Jesús no se va, deja de ser visible. En la Ascensión Cristo no nos dejó huérfanos, sino que se instaló más definitivamente entre nosotros con otras formas de presencia. «Yo estaré siempre con vosotros hasta la consumación de los siglos». Así lo había prometido y así lo cumplió. Por la Ascensión Cristo no se fue a otro lugar, sino que entró en la plenitud de su Padre como Dios y como hombre. Y precisamente por eso se puso más que nunca en relación con cada uno de nosotros.

Por esto es muy importante entender qué queremos decir cuando afirmamos que Jesús se fue al cielo o que está sentado a la derecha de Dios Padre.
