

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER PAVINO



Our Lord Jesus Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary share a deep and profound connection that enriches the understanding of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. As Catholics, we firmly believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus is the Eucharist and the Eucharist is Jesus.

The connection between the Eucharist and Mary can be traced back to the very beginnings of Christianity. Mary, as the mother of Jesus, played a pivotal role in the Incarnation—the moment when the Word became flesh. It was in her womb that Jesus, the Son of God, took on human form. This act of God becoming incarnate in Mary's womb laid the foundation for the Eucharistic theology. We believe in the real presence of Christ's body and blood in the consecrated bread and wine. This belief stems from Jesus' own words during the Last Supper when he said, "THIS IS MY BODY" and "THIS IS MY BLOOD" (Matthew 26:26-28). Mary's role in this mystery lies in her unique connection to Jesus' body. Mary was the first tabernacle, the vessel chosen by God to carry Jesus within her. Her "yes" to the angel Gabriel's announcement at the Annunciation initiated the Incarnation. In this sense, Mary is intimately linked to the physicality of Christ—his body and blood. This connection underscores her role in the Eucharistic narrative.

Furthermore, Mary's presence at the foot of the cross during Jesus' crucifixion is significant in the context of the Eucharist. As she witnessed her son's sacrifice, she shared in his suffering. Her sorrowful presence reminds believers that the Eucharist is not merely a commemoration but a participation in Christ's sacrificial love, where believers unite their own suffering and sacrifices with that of Christ. In Catholic tradition, Mary is often referred to as the "Mother of the Eucharist" or the "Eucharistic Woman." Her life and example serve as an inspiration for the faithful to approach the Eucharist with reverence, humility, and a deep sense of communion with Christ.

The connection between the Eucharist and Mary is a beautiful reminder of the Incarnation's significance and the profound role that Mary played in God's divine plan. It deepens the understanding of the Eucharist as a sacrament that allows believers to partake in the real presence of Christ, just as Mary did during her life.



Our Parish office will be closed on Wednesday November 1st, 2023 in observance of All Saint's Day. We will be open at normal office hours Thursday November 2, 2023.



Stroke Scan Plus will be hosting a Stroke, Vascular & Abdominal Ultrasound Screening at St. Peter Catholic Church on Saturday, January 13, 2024.

They will check the Carotid Arteries on both sides of the neck for fatty plaque build-up which accounts for 80% of all strokes. They check the Abdominal Aorta which is the main Artery off the Heart for Aneurysms, the Thyroid which controls the Metabolism for cyst, nodules and enlargements, the Liver, Gallbladder and both Kidney's for cyst, masses, fluid build-up and tumors.

These screenings are typically NOT performed at annual check-ups, nor will insurance companies pay for them unless you are symptomatic. Collectively, these screenings cost thousands in a hospital. Stroke Scan will be offering them to you for \$169 for all 7 combined. Health/Flex Savings Accounts are accepted. Please call 866-935-7226 to schedule an appointment today. A representative will be visiting the weekend of January 6th/7th to answer questions and for pre-registration. Prevention is the KEY to early detection.
