Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop

St. Turibius was originally a layman, but was chosen to be the next archbishop of Lima, Peru due to his well known character, intelligence, and holiness. He traveled to Peru and began to serve the community. He studied hard to learn the language in order to preach to the people in their native language, started one of the first seminaries in the Americas, and fought for the rights of the indigenous people. He always strived to preach Christ, famously saying, “**Christ said ‘I am the truth.’ He did not say, ‘I am the custom’.**”

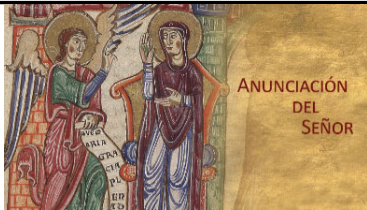

Celebrating with the Italian-American Community

En Oriente se encuentran testimonios de esta fiesta del 25 de marzo ya a mediados del siglo VI. En Roma se celebra a partir del siglo VII. Al ser una fiesta ligada al Señor Jesús y a su entrada en la historia, el nuevo orden litúrgico prefirió nombrarla con el título de “Anunciación del Señor” -en lugar del más popular “Anunciación de María”-. La solemnidad de la Anunciación del Señor es una fiesta navideña, aunque esté fuera del tiempo de Navidad: nueve meses antes de su nacimiento, tiene lugar la encarnación de Jesús en el seno de la Virgen María.

Una nueva historia

Es interesante observar que Dios no envía al ángel a Jerusalén, al templo, sino a Galilea, una región despreciada como refugio de paganos incrédulos. A Nazaret, una ciudad que no menciona el Antiguo Testamento.

El valor de María

Ante el anuncio, María reflexiona, entra en diálogo consigo misma y con el ángel, y pregunta por el sentido de sus palabras y la forma en que se realizarán. María no se deja llevar por las emociones. Aparece como una mujer valiente que ante lo inaudito mantiene el autocontrol. Y, a la luz de Dios, evalúa y decide.

La acción del Espíritu Santo

Es el Espíritu quien reviste la vida de María, haciéndola apta para su misión. Lo hará aquí y lo hará en el Cenáculo: María, mujer revestida del Espíritu, gracias a la cual y en la cual todo se hace posible.

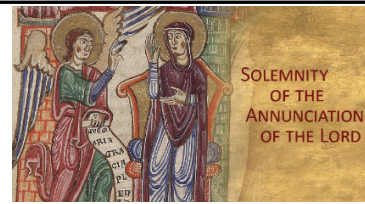
El “hágase” de María

El “Fiat” de María transforma su humilde casa en la Casa de Dios, y a ella misma en el Tabernáculo del Santísimo Jesús. Bastó un “Aquí estoy” una señal de disponibilidad, sabiendo confiar en la acción del Espíritu Santo. Y Dios entró en la historia aceptando hacerse historia en la vida de los que dijeron y seguirán diciendo “aquí estoy”

Coordenadas de María

La primera coordenada de María es creer: confiar y encomendarse a Dios, segura de que en Él nada es imposible. Dios no teme el tiempo del desconcierto, de la reflexión, de la comprensión: Dios no obliga a la libertad, sino que educa a la libertad, para que cada uno pueda decir su “Aquí estoy”. La segunda coordenada es aceptar entrar en el tiempo de Dios, en sus ritmos; un “tiempo” que no es simplemente el paso de las horas, sino que es el tiempo oportuno, el tiempo pleno, el tiempo de la oportunidad, el tiempo de la gracia.

As early as the middle of the 6th century in the East, and the 7th century in Rome, there is evidence of this Feast celebrated on 25 March. Since this feast is connected with the Lord Jesus and to His entry into history, the revised liturgical calendar gave this feast the title of the “Annunciation of the Lord”, over the more popular Annunciation of Mary. The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord is a Christmas feast even though it is not celebrated during the Christmas Season. Nine months before we celebrate the Lord’s birth, we celebrate His incarnation in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

God enters through the back door

The Annunciation is the Feast celebrating the Lord’s incarnation in Mary’s womb, initiating a new history. It is interesting to notice that God does not send the angel to the Temple in Jerusalem, but to Galilee, a despised region, considered a haven for unbelieving pagans. Nazareth is a city that is never mentioned in the Old Testament.

Mary is troubled

On hearing the Angel’s message, Mary reflects, she enters into dialogue with herself and with the angel, asking what his message meant and how it would happen. Mary does not allow herself to be overcome by her emotions. She appears as a courageous woman, who remains in control of herself even though she is faced with something unheard of. In the end, she evaluates and makes a decision in God’s light.

The action of the Holy Spirit

It is the Spirit who clothes Mary, making her fit for her mission. He does it here and He will do it again in the Upper Room. Mary is the woman clothed with the Spirit, thanks to whom and in whom everything becomes possible.

Mary’s Yes

Mary’s “Let it be done to me” transforms the humble house of “her” being into God’s House, becoming a Tabernacle of the Most High Jesus. All it took was her “Let it be done to me”, a sign of her willingness, knowing she could trust in the action of the Holy Spirit. And God entered into history, accepting to “make” history in the lives of those who have said and who would say over and over again, “Let it be done to me”.

Mary’s characteristics

Mary’s first characteristic is her faith. She believes and entrusts herself to God, certain that nothing is impossible for Him. God is not afraid of our moments of confusion, of reflection, of trying to understand. God does not force our freedom, but teaches us how to be free so that each one of us can say our own “Let it be done to me”. The second characteristic is that she accepted God’s time and pace— His time requires our time, it requires that we live more profoundly. God asks for our “yes”, but He also asks that we assume go at His “pace” and “time” which is not simply the ticking of the clock. God’s time is the right time, the fullness of time, the opportune moment, the moment of grace.

Siempre se esforzó por predicar a Cristo, pronunciando su célebre frase: **“Cristo dijo: ‘Yo soy la verdad’. No dijo: ‘Yo soy la costumbre’”**
