

EXTENDED CARE

- ALL Schedules for the following week must be submitted on MyProcare by the Friday before NOON! This allows us to properly staff and prepare for the week ahead. Teachers do not have access to MyProCare. Please communicate with your student's teacher or school office if extended care schedules change or are updated.
- Billing will be bi-weekly to coincide with Cluster payroll. Invoices will be emailed on Monday, payments due Friday of the same week. ACH payments will be pulled on that Friday as well.
- Reminder: Per the handbook, you are charged a minimum of 1 hour each time your child(ren) attends Extended Care.
 For example: Your child attends PM care (beginning at 3pm) and you pick them up at 3:30. You will still be billed for a full hour.

Behavioral Health Intervention Services

What are Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS)?

Behavioral Health Intervention Services are offered by Life Connections for children with severe emotional and behavioral issues. Our BHIS provider works with your family to help create a supportive environment at home. We offer the tools, training, and support that address the behavioral health of your children. A BHIS provider will work with your family in the privacy of your own home to ensure comfort and to learn new skills in the environment that many issues occur. Your child will participate in a combination of skill-building interventions that can target specific behavioral struggles and help to improve your child's skills and empower you to help them manage those behaviors effectively. Skills can be built in the areas of communication, learning to cope with other difficult emotions, conflict resolution, and decision making, to name a few.

Who is eligible to receive BHIS Services?

Youth aged 18 and under are eligible for BHIS Services with Life Connections. In order to qualify, clients must have a mental health diagnosis and be involved with Mental Health Therapy Services. Medicaid (Title 19) is accepted for Behavioral Health Services, and there is no DHS or juvenile court system requirement in order to receive services.

Life Connections is now offering the wonderful opportunity to work with students in the school in order to work on and alleviate barriers

Behavioral Health services are services where the counselor works with both the child and their family to work on behavioral modification; by way of anger management, coping skills, reduction in reactive behaviors among many other types of behaviors which can include social skills. Behavioral health services may be conducted in the school (in a private and confidential location) for the individual portion of services for the client; all family services have to be conducted in a confidential location where at least one of the children's biological or adoptive parents are engaged.

There are many reasons why the children having in school sessions is helpful and productive for them; first there are a lot of clients who are students that have significant barriers of in school behaviors-this allows for the children to be able to work on those barriers in a manner in which they are encountering those barriers. Next, many of these children do not have a place where they feel safe to talk about the barriers they encounter or their feelings at home as the families are often around to hear the discussions taking place. In conjunction with those; this allows the opportunity for our counselors to help alleviate possible triggers and provide support to the teachers by way of items that might allow the student and teacher to work together and reduce reactive behavior within the school or classroom.

BHIS services are covered under lowa Medicaid (not hawk-i), if there is anything we can do to help assist your school and students please do not hesitate to reach out.
