Benefits of Reciting the Chaplet

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a simple prayer – yet so powerful that God will send his mercy immediately. According to the Catholic Church, the essence of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is remarkable in its great simplicity. However, it is important to know that the Chaplet is a simple and easy-to-understand summary of the Gospel message, which was preached by Jesus Christ himself when he adopted the human form and came to earth.

In this regard, the church wants you to fully comprehend the mercy and kindness of the Lord with heart.
