~ From the Pastor ~

"My heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved." Romans 10:1



Mes chers amis,

*"I am the living bread that came down from Heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:41). Our Lord tells us that the Holy Eucharist is intimately linked to the Eternal Life of Heaven. This is done in two ways: First, through the celebration of Holy Mass, **we join the whole court of Heaven** in worshipping the Father through His Son - the Lamb who is sacrificed. Secondly, by receiving the Holy Eucharist properly disposed, we are **given the grace to live in a way that we will be brought to Heaven** as well as to give an important witness to it in the*

midst of our sinful world.

Naturally, then, our thoughts should turn to the way in which we both participate in the offering of the Holy Mass and how we receive Our Lord in His Body and Blood. It's difficult to deny that the Church has gone through many difficulties with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist in the last 50 years in different parts of the US and throughout the world. Because of a misunderstanding of the Second Vatican Council, many abuses were brought into the Church's Sacred Liturgy, some became regularized, and many continue to happen today. Following Pope St. John Paul II who showed a great love for the Holy Eucharist and wrote beautifully about it, Pope Benedict made the renewal and reform of the Sacred Liturgy a principle aim of his Papal ministry. He had written extensively about it throughout the years, and as Pope, led the way in showing how the Church should celebrate Holy Mass. This is what he said in 2001:

"What we previously knew only in theory has become for us a practical experience: the Church stands and falls with the Liturgy. When the adoration of the divine Trinity declines, when the faith no longer appears in its fullness in the Liturgy of the Church, when man's words, his thoughts, his intentions are suffocating him, then faith will have lost the place where it is expressed and where it dwells. For that reason, the true celebration of the Sacred Liturgy is the center of any renewal of the Church whatever." (Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger, Lecture given at the Abbey of Fontgombault, France, 2001)

The richness of the Sacred Liturgy is the heart of our Catholic faith. May our celebration and adoration of the Holy Eucharist continue to lead us all to strive for the goal of sanctity and the Eternal Life of Heaven!

The Solemnity of Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven is this Wednesday, August 15. It's a holy day of obligation. Please see the schedule of Masses here in the bulletin. Also, don't forget about this year's Fete Dieu du Mississippi on Wednesday, August 14 and Thursday, August 15. Let us join the whole Church in celebrating our mother Mary's entrance into eternal glory, praying that where she has gone before us, we may one day follow. We celebrate the hope our culture has passed down to us: "Au ciel, au ciel, au ciel, j'irai la voir un jour!" (In Heaven, in Heaven, in Heaven, one day I will go to see her!).

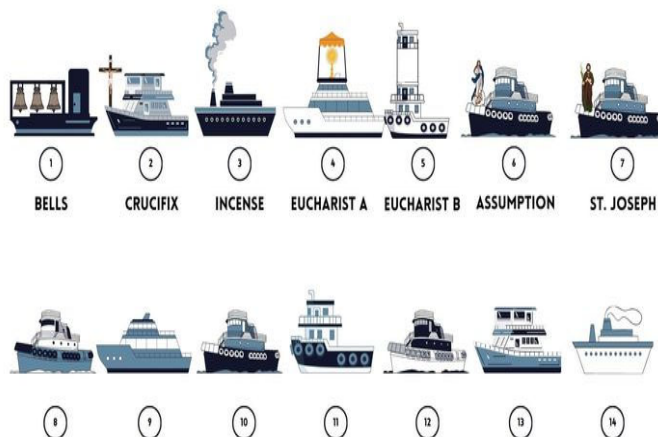

The Order of the procession for the 130-mile Fete-Dieu du Mississippi

Bells have been used for nearly two millennia to call people to prayer and to announce the presence of the Lord.

The Eucharistic Procession will be led by bells, announcing the Lord's coming and calling for "attention on deck" as the Lord in the Eucharist nears. The Cross of Jesus goes before us and we conquer in the sign of the Cross. St. Paul tells the Corinthians that He resolved to preach only Jesus and Him Crucified, so the Cross comes next in our procession. Psalm 140 speaks of our prayers rising like incense before the Lord and the Book of Revelation speaks of bowls of incense carried by angels in the Presence of the Lord. The procession will be led by an incense boat so that the sweet smelling smoke, representing the shekinah or "Glory Cloud" will waft up in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist boat will be a floating Church with an altar and upon it the monstrance, "showing" the Lord to His People, and covered with a canopy as are kings seated in their reign.

The flotilla will include a boat carrying a statue of the Mother of God under the title of the Assumption, since August 15th is the Feast of the Assumption, and Feast of the Acadians who were consecrated to Mary under that title. She follows the Blessed Sacrament boat since she is always near her Son. The last boat will be the St. Joseph boat which will carry a statue of St. Joseph, husband of Mary, and Protector of the Holy Family and the Church. He comes at the rear of the procession as he guards the Holy House. Other boats will join inside the procession behind the Lord symbolizing our common journey behind Jesus through the waters of this life into the Eternal Shores of Heaven.

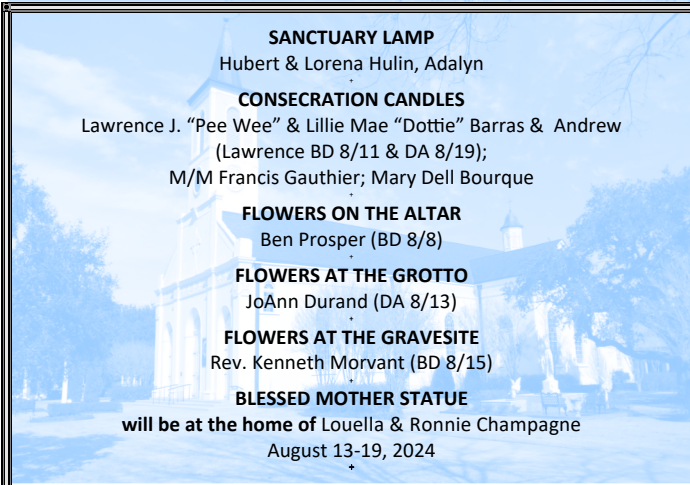

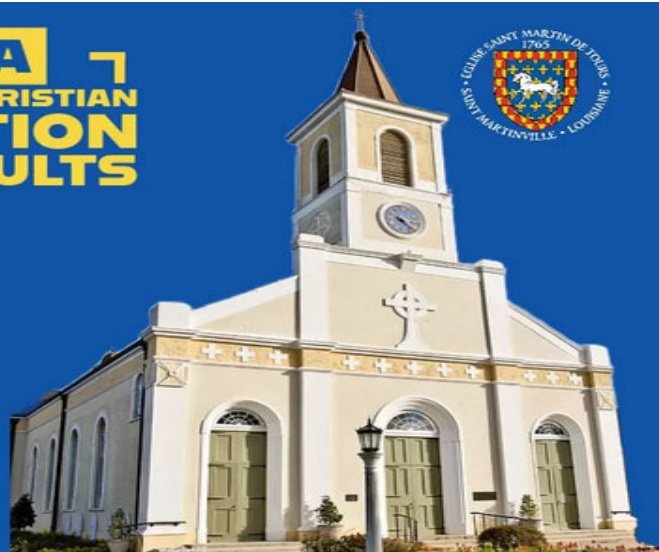

The Marie -Agatha
(St. Martin de Tours) Bell
will be in the Fete-Dieu du
Mississippi Procession on
August 14 & 15, 2024



The Bells of Louisiana! Over 730 years of calling Louisianans to prayer will grace the lead boat of Fete-Dieu du Mississippi! The Marie-Agatha was the first bell placed in Church of St. Martin de Tours in 1850. Bell no. 2 was cast in 1894 originally for St. Mary Magdalene Church in Abbeville. It later called monks to prayer in Olivetan monasteries in Lake Arthur, Lake Charles, and Plaisance. The bell St. Joseph from St. John the Baptist in Edgard also dates from 1894. The fourth bell was cast in 1896 for the First Baptist mission in St. Martinville. Bell number five adorned the Belfrey of St. Mary's in Union, Louisiana near Convent until it fell during hurricane Betsy. The bell was cast for St. Mary's in 1938. Bell number six is a 1947 bell which called seminarians at Immaculata seminary to prayer daily in Lafayette. Listen for the bells along the Mississippi on August 14 and 15th as they announce the coming of the king and call us to prayer.
