~ From the Pastor ~

“My heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved.” Romans 10:1

Mes chers amis,

As we hear the Gospel passage from St. Luke on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, let us ponder the wisdom of Pope Benedict XVI and his thoughts about it:

“The liturgical year is a great journey of faith made by the Church, always preceded by her Mother, the Virgin Mary. This year, during the Sundays in Ordinary Time, the path is marked by readings from St. Luke’s Gospel. Today it brings us to *“a level place”* (Lk 6: 17), where Jesus stops with the Twelve and where a crowd of other disciples and people who had come from everywhere gather to listen to Him. This is the setting for the proclamation of the “Beatitudes” (Lk 6: 20-26; cf. Mt 5: 1-12). Jesus, lifting up His eyes to His disciples, says: *“Blessed are you poor...Blessed are you that hunger...Blessed are you that weep...Blessed are you when men hate you...when they cast out your name”* on account of me. Why does He proclaim them blessed? Because God’s justice will ensure that they will be satisfied, gladdened, recompensed for every false accusation in a word, because from this moment He will welcome them into His Kingdom. The Beatitudes are based on the fact that a divine justice exists, which exalts those who have been wrongly humbled and humbles those who have exalted themselves (cf. Lk 14:11). In fact, the Evangelist Luke, after repeating four times *“Blessed are you”*, adds four admonitions: *“Woe to you that are rich...Woe to you that are full now...Woe to you that laugh now”* and: *“Woe to you, when all men speak well of you”*, because as Jesus affirms, the circumstances will be reversed; the last will be first, and the first will be last (cf. Lk 13: 30).

This justice and this Beatitude are realized in the *“Kingdom of Heaven”*, or the *“Kingdom of God”*, which will be fulfilled at the end of times but which is already present in history. Wherever the poor are comforted and admitted to the banquet of life, there God’s justice is already manifest. This is the work that the Lord’s disciples are called to carry out also in today’s society.

Christ’s Gospel responds positively to Man’s thirst for justice, but in an unexpected and surprising way. He does not propose a social or political revolution but rather one of love, which He has already brought about with His Cross and His Resurrection. It is on these that are founded the Beatitudes which present a new horizon of justice, unveiled at Easter, thanks to which we can become just and build a better world.

Dear friends, let us turn to the Virgin Mary. All the generations call her “blessed”, because she believed the good news that the Lord proclaimed (cf. Lk 1: 45-48). Let us be guided by her on our journey, to be freed from the illusion of self-sufficiency, to recognize that we need God and His mercy, and thus to enter into His Kingdom of justice, of love and of peace.”

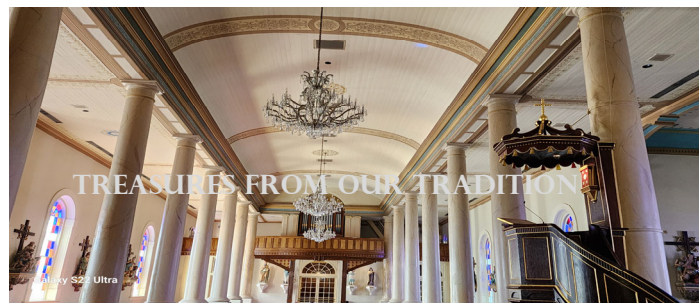

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Valentine's Day approaches, and its immediate impact may be heard in the rectory, as the newly engaged come forward to "set a date." We owe this scenario to reforms made by the emperor Charlemagne late in the eighth century. He required that nobles and commoners alike have public weddings, and also required that marrying couples be examined for factors that would block a marriage, such as previous marriages or close kinship. The pope was more conservative, however, and resisted the emperor's creativity. It was enough for the pope that the couples exchange consent.

That tradition is passed on to this day, to some couples' surprise. In 866, Pope Nicholas ruled that a marriage was legal and binding even without a liturgy or public celebration. After that, it was the consent of the couple, not the blessing of parents or priest, that made a marriage "count." If consent was lacking, such as through abduction or fear, then the marriage could not "take." Charlemagne got a great deal done, but he was a political flash in the pan, and the empire had virtually collapsed by the year 1000. Europe broke into a checkerboard of princedoms and languages, and at last all marriages came under the church, the glue holding the known world together.

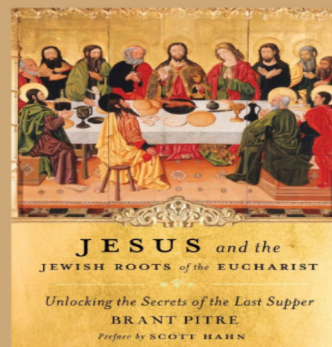

REFLECTION CORNER

Blessing in Disguise

Years ago my sister was very bold in witnessing about her faith in God. I remember thinking she was really out there – had crossed an invisible line – and it was not good. My other siblings and I criticized her for going too far. At the time, I was Catholic in name only, not practicing my faith and lacking any substantive relationship with God. Still, I admired her courage in sharing her faith when those around her rejected it, and her.

Today I am different. I have returned to the faith of my childhood and God has showered down graces in abundance. Several of my other sisters and I have crossed the invisible line and boldly share our faith. Reading the Beatitudes reminds me that those who speak freely about God will face rejection, just like my sister did. "Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice and leap for joy on that day!" Rejection is not something we seek or desire naturally—quite the opposite. We want acceptance. We want to fit in. But Jesus tells us that we will be blessed in our rejection if it is caused by our relationship with Him. Rejection is a blessing in disguise. The world sees it as a curse, only capable of seeing it from a secular worldview. We Christians are called to adopt a supernatural worldview where troubles are blessings.

How can we see troubles as blessings?
Here are four ways:

By knowing that we are carrying out God's will. If God calls me to speak a word of truth to a friend, I am blessed because God chose me to speak that particular word. He could have chosen anyone but He chose me. I am blessed.

By realizing we are acting as Christ in the world. When I am rejected, they are rejecting Christ in me, which means they SEE Christ in me. That is a blessing. I must be doing something right.

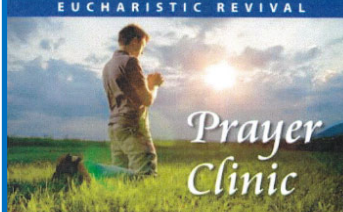
By uniting our suffering with Christ, who was also rejected. We are better able to relate to His rejection. Jesus chose to come in human form, to be rejected and murdered for our salvation. The love He showed for us is beyond imagining, so how can we not leap for joy when we are rejected like Him?

By allowing our rejection to spur intercessory prayer. Surely my sister who boldly shared her faith all those years ago prayed often for me and the rest of the family. We needed an intercessor to offer prayers for our conversion of heart. And her prayers were effective. Her rejection became a blessing to us and to her.

I have joined my sister and crossed the line to boldly speak God's truth in the world. Sometimes I am rejected. It saddens me because I want to share God's love, but I remember the words of Jesus and know that my rejection is a blessing in disguise.

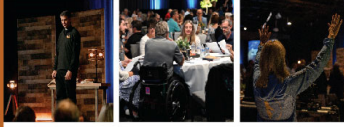

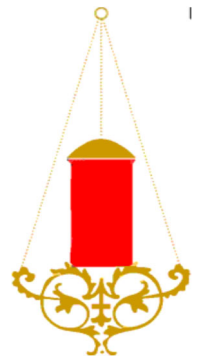

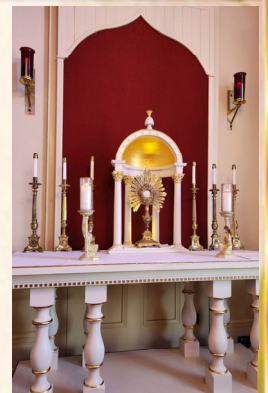
