~ From the Pastor ~

"My heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved." Romans 10:1



Mes chers amis,

We've already arrived at the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Traditionally, this Sunday is rather unique; like the Third Sunday of Advent ("Gaudete Sunday"), the Fourth Sunday of Lent is a small break in an otherwise penitential season. The vestments for this day can be rose, as they are on Gaudete Sunday in Advent, and flowers may adorn the Altar. This day is called "Laetare Sunday", and takes its name from the opening words of the Mass, the Introit's "Laetare, Jerusalem":

According to very ancient Roman tradition, serious penance and fasting did not begin until Monday of the third week before Easter (the day after this Sunday). Thus, *Laetare* was the last day before the period of strict discipline. It was not until later that Lent was lengthened to forty days, making a Tuesday into

Laetare Ierusalem: et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam: gaudete cum laetitia, qui in tristitia fuistis: ut exsultetis, et satiemini ab uberibus consolationis vestrae. (Psalm) Laetatus sum in his, quae dicta sunt mihi: in domum Domini ibimus.

Rejoice, O Jerusalem: and come together all you that love her: rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow: that you may exult, and be filled from the breasts of your consolation. (Psalm) I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord.

"Mardi Gras" literally in French "Fat Tuesday", the day people had to use up the animal fats in their houses. *Laetare* is therefore a refreshment stop on the pilgrimage toward Easter: think of water-stations along the route of a Marathon race. Together with the joy of approaching Easter, this Sunday is about the Heavenly Jerusalem we long for, which is anticipated in the Church and the Most Holy Eucharist.

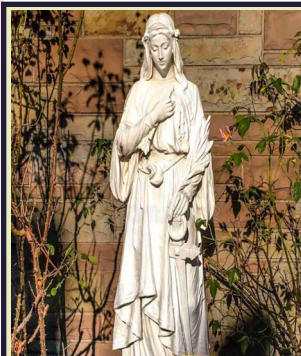
In a special way, I ask you to do all you can to attend the liturgies of Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum that are coming. Leave work early, reschedule ball games, etc. Holy Week is the high point of our Catholic Faith and hopefully our Lenten practices will have helped us to prepare well to celebrate it with great faith and devotion.

Fourth Sunday of Easter TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The reception of Holy Communion at Sunday Mass is such an expected feature of the Mass these days that it is surprising to realize that for many centuries, receiving Communion was a relatively rare event in the life of a faithful Christian. "Easter duty" means that Catholics must celebrate reconciliation if aware of serious sin, and receive Holy Communion during the Easter season. For a while, this was a requirement of Easter week, and later extended to the whole season of fifty days, and even beyond that by a few weeks. For the majority of people long ago, this meant Communion was a once-a-year moment. A rather complex bureaucracy grew up around this rule in the Middle Ages.

Amazingly, people received a kind of token at confession admitting them to Communion in their home parish, which then kept careful records and reported them to the bishop.

Surviving records can tell us a great deal about our ancestors. In fact, people were encouraged to journey to the church of their baptism in order to fulfill their duty, and therefore the Easter duty includes in its origins a grateful pilgrimage to the font in which you were first embraced by Christ. If your "Holy Mother Church" is within a drive, why not make a pilgrimage to that font be a feature of your Easter celebration of these fifty days?

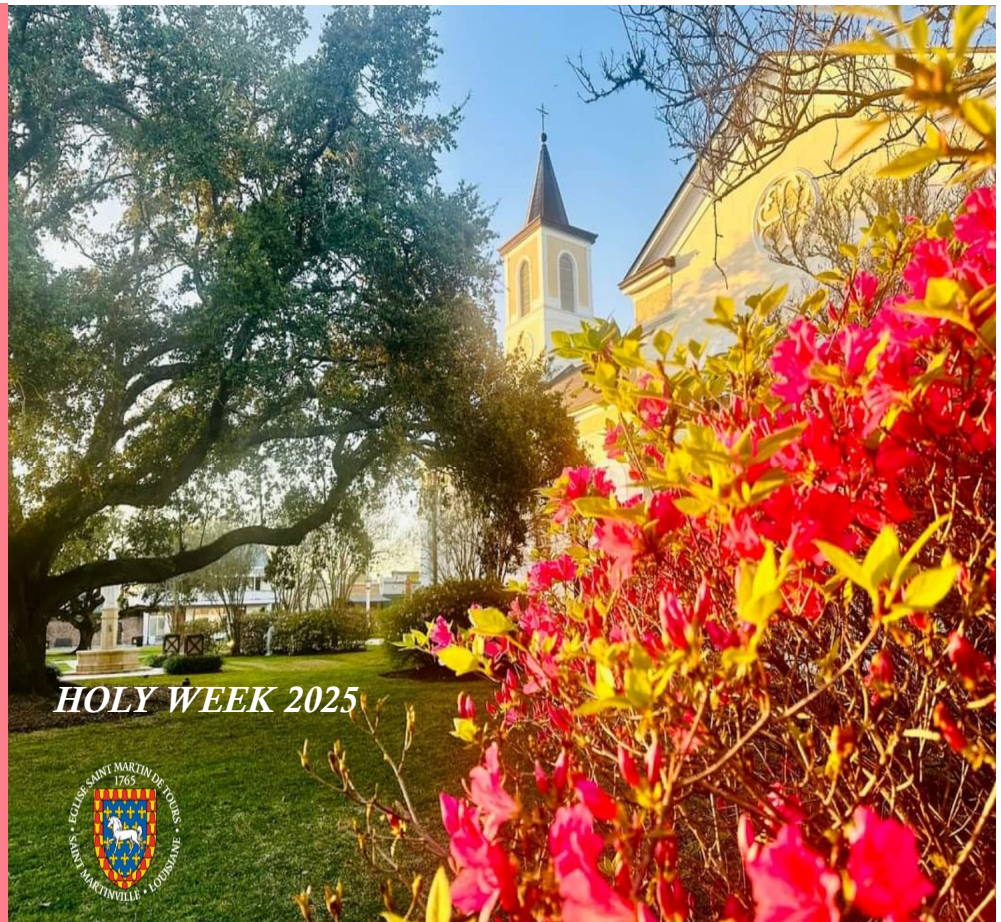

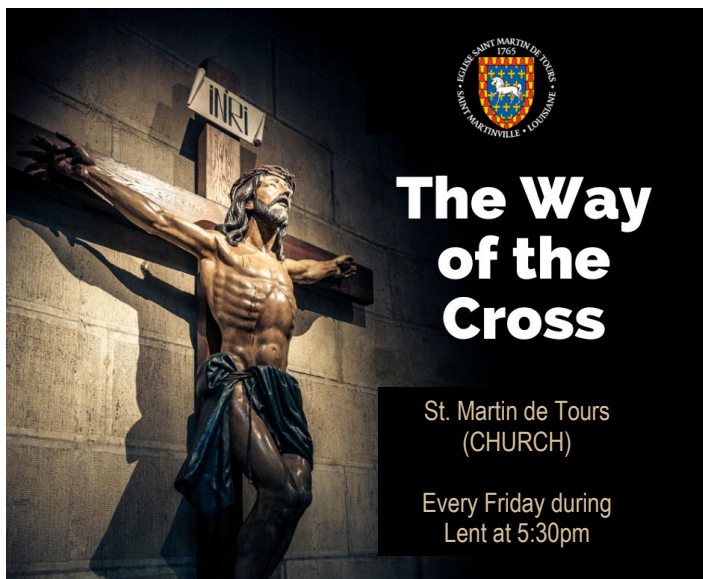

REFLECTION CORNER

God's Merciful Embrace

I find myself struggling to sit with this parable. As if silence and stillness aren't difficult enough, the parable is too familiar and my interest wanes. Moreover, my soul is anxious at the thought that God might actually speak truth into my life. I'll be honest, it terrifies me. Yet, I know God loves me so I must dive into the deep.

What jumps out at me is the prodigal's distance. We're all guilty of being far from God from time to time. We writhe in jealousy, we cling to plans, we pride ourselves in our good works, or we consent to serious mortal sin.

I've been far from God on multiple occasions. Sometimes, to my chagrin, I've walked very far from God. I know this is why it pains me to read this parable. I've gone to confession, amended my life, sought spiritual direction, prepared speeches to the Father, yet the thought that I squandered my heavenly inheritance, and even worse, turned my back on my best friend Jesus, kills me.

Oh, my Jesus, what do you say? "While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." Luke 15:20.

That's what I was afraid of. The overwhelming power of God's mercy. It is too big for me to contain but it's exactly what my broken heart and memory needs. My heart yearns to receive His all encompassing love and tenderness. He knows me and I know my Beloved. He knows that I long to be wrapped in garments of His affection and bedecked with his claim over me. I know He is the Father of love and He never takes His eyes off of me.

I don't know if you've ever been far from God, I pray not for your sake. If so, I hope you muster the courage to sit and receive this Gospel. Receive God's mercy in full. If you have not, is there someone in your life who needs a return to the Father's heart? Would you be brave and extend the merciful embrace of the Father to them?

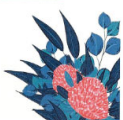

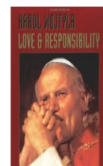
