Mes chers amis,

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, we contemplate Our Lord Jesus as the Good Shepherd. This image of Our Lord was one of the most important images for Christians in the early Church. It's one of the oldest images of Jesus, found in the catacombs in Rome on many tombs of those who died in Christ. By "laying down His life for His sheep", Jesus has radically fulfilled Psalm 23. He alone can be called the Good Shepherd. And if we hear and follow His voice, He will lead us to Eternal Life.

In its long history, our Parish of St. Martin de Tours has provided the Church with many Priestly vocations. And we must also continue to pray for more shepherds after Our Lord's own Sacred Heart and continue to cultivate vocations to the Priesthood from our Parish. That's the reason this Sunday is also the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI told the Church: "The Church needs holy Priests; ministers capable of helping the faithful to experience the Lord's merciful love, and convinced witnesses of that love...let us ask the Lord to set the heart of every Priest afire with that "pastoral charity" which can make him one in heart and mind with Jesus the High Priest, and thus to imitate Jesus in complete self-giving. May the Virgin Mary...obtain this grace for us."

We need the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Holy Eucharist. And we need Priests. Holy Priests like the Good Shepherd!

by listening to the Father's voice and responding with a sacrificial love.

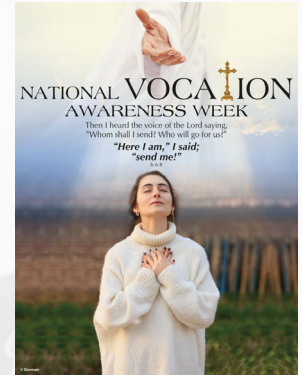

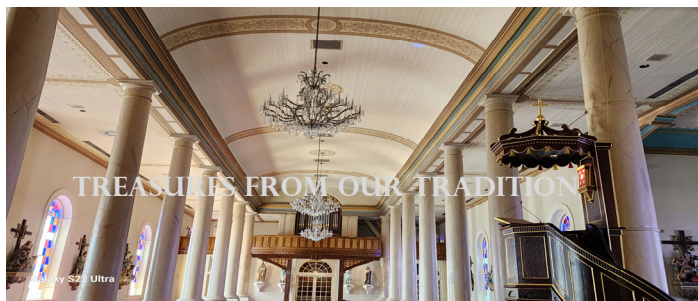

Fourth Sunday of Easter TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The reception of Holy Communion at Sunday Mass is such an expected feature of the Mass these days that it is surprising to realize that for many centuries, receiving Communion was a relatively rare event in the life of a faithful Christian. "Easter duty" means that Catholics must celebrate reconciliation if aware of serious sin, and receive Holy Communion during the Easter season. For a while, this was a requirement of Easter week, and later extended to the whole season of fifty days, and even beyond that by a few weeks. For the majority of people long ago, this meant Communion was a once-a-year moment. A rather complex bureaucracy grew up around this rule in the Middle Ages. Amazingly, people received a kind of token at confession admitting them to Communion in their home parish, which then kept careful records and reported them to the bishop.

Surviving records can tell us a great deal about our ancestors. In fact, people were encouraged to journey to the church of their baptism in order to fulfill their duty, and therefore the Easter duty includes in its origins a grateful pilgrimage to the font in which you were first embraced by Christ. If your "Holy Mother Church" is within a drive, why not make a pilgrimage to that font be a feature of your Easter celebration of these fifty days?

REFLECTION CORNER

We Still Hear Jesus' Voice

"My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me."

I have to admit for many years I had a certain idea of what Jesus' voice sounded like. My assumptions came from the first verse of this Gospel. Sheep are not very intelligent animals and need a shepherd to protect them, make sure they are fed and healthy, and lead them to safe pastures. When I "heard" Jesus' voice in my heart, it was always gentle, meek, caring, a "what can I do for you" type of voice. When I made my thirty-day Ignatian retreat I heard another type of voice when Jesus spoke to my heart: it was clear, firm, and understanding. It was the voice of authority that wanted the very best, and only the best for me. Sometimes that meant I had to confront areas of my life that needed repentance and healing. Other times I needed to know that I was loved even in my poverty and weakness. Still other times Jesus needed me to realize that he was the one who does things, not me. It was the voice of the One who died that I might live forever in communion with God. It was a voice of urgency and patience. Jesus' voice in the Gospels has many of these characteristics. Think of his words to Mary Magdalen in the garden of the resurrection. I would have expected Him to reach out to her, tell her that everything was going to be okay, and express his sympathy with what she had suffered. Instead, He calls her by name, tells her not to cling to Him, and to go and tell His brothers that He had risen. Clear, strong, real, amazing, urgent; the voice of authority, the voice of love. Think of Zacchaeus, the Sermon on the Mount, or His words to Peter at various times during the three years of the public ministry. Remember how Jesus spoke to the Syrian Phoenician Gentile woman and His commanding words to the spirit that possessed the boy who was deaf and mute. What about the 5,000 people scattered across the fields listening to Jesus' preaching. "You feed them yourselves," He said to his disciples. And His words to His apostles at the Last Supper, "This is my body. This is my blood." And in His appearance to His apostles after the resurrection, "Peace be with you." There are a thousand different variations of tone and intent and desire and command and mercy in the voice of the Good Shepherd.

We, the sheep, still hear Jesus' voice today. "I absolve you from your sins." "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." We hear his voice as we read the Scriptures. Our soul may be illuminated by a gesture that moves us deeply or by an unexpected kindness. How sweet and strong and true is the voice of our Shepherd!
