~ From the Pastor ~

"My heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved." Romans 10:1

Mes chers amis,

In addition to being the month of the Holy Rosary, October is also Respect Life month. We re-focus on our urgent obligation of doing what we can personally to protect the dignity of every human person and to show our love for life - in all stages - that must be respected. Below is a snippet of the courageous speech Mother Teresa gave when receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in December 11, 1979. *Abortion is the greatest destroyer of peace!*

"I was surprised in the West to see so many young boys and girls given into drugs, and I tried to find out why - why is it like that, and the answer was: Because there is no one in the family to receive them. Father and mother are so busy they have no time. Young parents are in some institution and the child takes back to the street and gets involved in something. We are talking of peace. These are things that break peace, but I feel the greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because it is a direct war, a direct killing - direct murder by the mother herself. And we read in the Scripture, for God says very clearly: Even if a mother could forget her child - I will not forget you - I have carved you in the palm of my hand. We are carved in the palm of His hand, so close to Him that unborn child has been carved in the hand of God. And that is what strikes me most, the beginning of that sentence, that even if a mother could forget something impossible - but even if she could forget - I will not forget you. And today the greatest means - the greatest destroyer of peace is abortion. And we who are standing here - our parents wanted us. We would not be here if our parents would do that to us. Our children, we want them, we love them, but what of the millions. Many people are very, very concerned with the children in India, with the children in Africa where quite a number die, maybe of malnutrition, of hunger and so on, but millions are dying deliberately by the will of the mother. And this is what is the greatest destroyer of peace today. Because if a mother can kill her own child - what is left for me to kill you and you kill me - there is nothing between. And this I appeal in India, I appeal everywhere: Let us bring the child back, and this year being the child's year: What have we done for the child? At the beginning of the year I told, I spoke everywhere and I said: Let us make this year that we make every single child born, and unborn, wanted. And today is the end of the year, have we really made the children wanted? I will give you something terrifying. We are fighting abortion by adoption, we have saved thousands of lives, we have sent words to all the clinics, to the hospitals, police stations - please don't destroy the child, we will take the child. So every hour of the day and night it is always somebody, we have quite a number of unwedded mothers - tell them come, we will take care of you, we will take the child from you, and we will get a home for the child. And we have a tremendous demand from families who have no children, that is the blessing of God for us." - St. Teresa of Calcutta

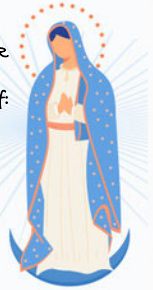

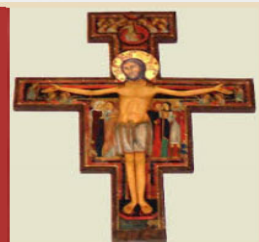

Christian liturgy has always contained an opportunity to make a choice for sharing. From the beginning, Christians pooled their resources, especially for the care of widows and orphans, at the weekly Eucharist. Over the years, the collection became detached from the liturgy and baskets or plates would be passed through the community while the Mass was going on at the altar, or contributions would be collected at the doors. In Milan's Ambrosian Rite, these gifts have always brought to the altar by lay people in procession. In German countries, the ancient custom was for the entire assembly to process with their gifts—first the men, then the women, then the priests and deacons—to offer their gifts at the altar. The old ceremony of canonization included a curious vestige of this procession: people would present the pope with two loaves of bread, two barrels of wine and water, five candles, and three cages containing pigeons or turtledoves!

Pause, Notice, and Give Thanks

I have been in a difficult season in my life for some time. One thing after another seems to pull me down as I continue to wrestle with long-term problems as well. In this space, problems quickly come into focus while blessings blur into the background.

While I know I am not alone, I feel as if I am. Once in that state, it is easy to stay there. Like the lepers of today's Gospel, I frequently call out spiritually or emotionally, "Unclean! Unclean!" to those around me, standing at a distance even from God, wanting to taste joy and hope but unsure as to how to get back there. I know God wants to pull me close, but He seems so far away.

God's words, while more powerful than the hopelessness that tries to hold me down, are quieter and more subtle. Like a whisper, they are difficult to hear over the constant noise in my head. I find myself dragging one foot forward and plopping it in front of the other, doing whatever I can to just make my way through the day. But God is calling me to pause and notice the little inklings of change, to reclaim the dreams and holy desires He is calling me back to, to dwell on the fact that I am His beloved. And so are you.

When we are in difficult seasons, He implores us to remember what He has done for us in the past and the ways He has called us and restored us when we have struggled before. He invites us to recall the dreams and desires He has given us and the ways He has cultivated the corresponding gifts within us.

Like the one leper who returned to give thanks, God is calling us to pause and notice, to receive His blessings, to turn around and return to Him, and to give Him thanks and praise. Those blessings may be small and seemingly insignificant, bringing us back to wholeness slowly, or they may be life-changing, as they were for the leper, restoring us in one huge leap.

It is important that we pause and notice rather than mindlessly continuing on our way, that we lift our minds and hearts to God and give Him thanks, that we turn our hearts to Him, allowing each blessing to begin an even more important work - that of finding our home with Him once again.

God can work a miracle in us, big or small. He can begin the work of restoring our hearts. But if we don't pause long enough to receive the gift and lift our hearts back to Him, His love and healing can't penetrate as deeply as He intends. He wants to give us hope and draw us back to His heart. Will you let Him?

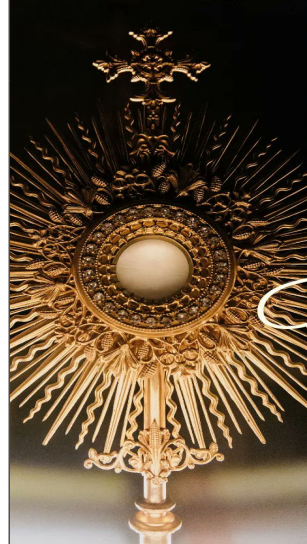
