MEMORIES


Round us tonight comes astealing,

It even looks as though Barbara had jilted her boy friend, George, and eloped with Rockwood's son Matt, although they were on an errand of mercy.

But with the help of the Rural Romeo, Lawyer Loomis, a delightful old geezer, Walter, and Carson, the local policeman, all is helpfully and intelligently solved.
