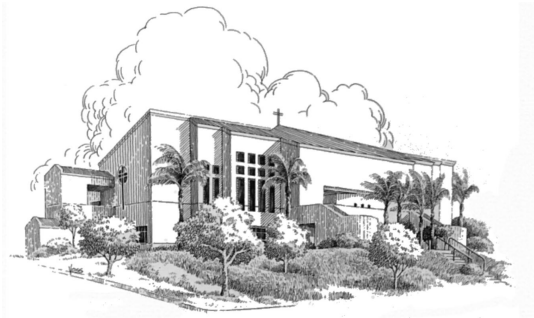

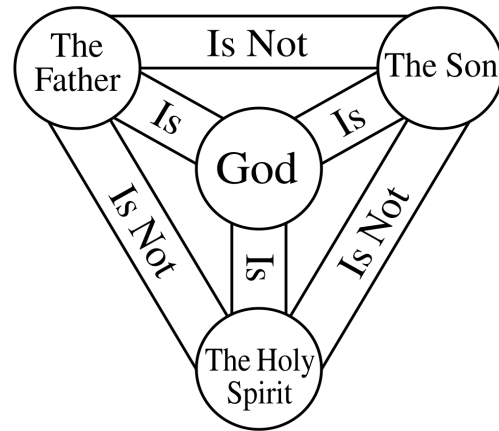

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of your divine Majesty to worship the Unity: Keep us steadfast in this faith and worship, and bring us at last to see you in your one and eternal glory, O Father; who with the Son and the Holy Spirit live and reign, God, for ever and ever.



First Reading: Exodus 34:4-9

This is one of the really very central passages of the Bible. In Judaism the special name of God (sometimes written 'Yahweh') is never spoken.

For two reasons: It is too sacred and awesome to be pronounced, for the name somehow makes the personality present. It is also too intimate: we do not casually use in public the special family name by which we are affectionately known by our nearest and dearest. So where the name occurs in the Bible, it is often simply replaced by the title 'LORD'.

The personal name of God was intimately revealed to Moses at the Burning Bush, but not its meaning. Here for the first time the meaning is given, 'The LORD, the LORD, a God of tenderness and compassion.' Only when God has to forgive Israel for its first, heinous but rapid, rebellion, is the meaning of the name revealed. And this meaning is echoed again and again down the Holy Scriptures. Even the prophet Jonah has to reluctantly submit to its meaning, when God forgives the city Nineveh of its sins! Our God is the God of Divine Mercy, revealed to us as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
