Hello Everyone,

I hope the school year has gotten off to a good start for you and your student. This email is to inform you of the recent setback in the food service division. It was discovered on Sunday evening, September 8, 2019, that our server for the school cafeterias, which is based at the Catholic Center had been hacked. The Catholic Center is on a different server than the food service, so theirs was not breeched.

I have been informed by the Diocese's IT person and my IT software company that ALL personal information for students as well as monetary balances are SAFE. NO information has been stolen. All activity for this school year has been saved. We have lost prior year reporting information because we are having to start from scratch with a new server.

The daily lunch records are being kept manually by my staff on emergency rosters at each school. The server is expected to be up and running hopefully before the week's end. When the system is up and running, I will key those meals into the system. The activity that will be viewed shows all the sales on the date it was keyed in. So, the student account may show four lunches occurring on 9-12. Snacks will not be sold during the repair period, but will resume as soon as account information can be accessed. Enrollment Process For Incoming Freshman and Transfer Students

Choosing a high school is a huge step in every student's educational career. We encourage students to explore the many opportunities at Lexington Catholic High School (LCHS).

The first step in the admissions process is to schedule a tour of the school with our Admissions team and set up a shadow day for the prospective student. On the shadow day, a current student will host the prospective student and guide them throughout their visit as they experience actual classes and meet students and teachers. Eighth grade students enrolled at our partner schools will participate in a group visit day in the fall, and are not required to do an additional shadow visit.

The next step is to take the High School Placement Test (HSPT). Once the school receives a student's HSPT scores and information from middle school teachers, a letter regarding admission will be mailed. Families of students who are accepted may enroll online beginning in mid January 2020. If you are a transfer student, instead of taking the HSPT, please submit your transcript, report card, and schedule a shadow visit and/or meeting with the principal and Vice President of Admissions and Enrollment Services.
