READINGS AND REFLECTION

**Acts 12:1—11; Psalm 34; 2Timothy 4:6—8, 17—18;
Matthew 16:13—19**

Today's feast of St. Peter and St. Paul is almost entirely devoted to St. Peter, bishop of Rome. After the descent of the Holy Spirit, St. Peter preached the gospel in Judea and was cast into prison by the cruel Herod. He was miraculously delivered by an angel and established his See first at Antioch, and then finally in Rome. Like St. Paul, he died at Rome during the persecution of Nero c. 64-68 A.D. by being crucified head downward. The apostle Peter and Paul rely totally on God to guide them and to grant faith to those who hear their preaching. Their human weakness makes God's power more obvious (2 Tim 4:6-8,17-18). Although not one of the twelve, Paul is also called an Apostle. By his own admission he was the Apostle "born abnormally" (1 Cor 15:8), having encountered the resurrected Jesus as he rode to persecute the Christians of Damascus and became the great evangelizer in the vast Gentile territory in the eastern Mediterranean.

Today's Gospel (Mt 16:13-19), Simon Peter confesses Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus responds solemnly: "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." To the Jews, a change of name means a change of the very person and of that person's life. Peter will be the human rock of firmness that will protect the word of God and will guide the whole Church.

St. Peter and St. Paul, whom we honor today, could tell us so much about life and death. They had difficulties but they had peace within. They were humble and let Christ lead them and overcame their fears as missionaries and made them witnesses of Christ to the ends of the then-known world. How can I follow the missionary zeal of Peter and Paul today.

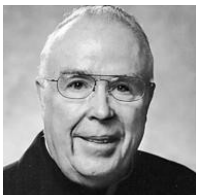

Dear Padre,

Why is a lighted candle always in front of the tabernacle in my church?

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* states that “a special lamp...should shine permanently to indicate the presence of Christ and honor it.” In the past, this candle was to be made of fine-quality beeswax. Now it can be fueled by either wax or oil, with no specification of the kind or quality (*GIRM* 316).

This use of a candle or oil lamp is not new to Christianity. We see the use of lamps near the Holy of Holies, a room in the Temple of Jerusalem. The vision of the heavenly throne room, portrayed vividly in the Book of Daniel, describes the use of lamps in front of the divine throne. In our own day, a perpetual flame honors the dead at the graves of the Unknown Soldier and President John F. Kennedy.

Some pastors ask parishioners to help purchase these candles and lamps. In return, these lamps are lighted for the intentions of donors, making these candles also acts of petition before the reserved Eucharist.
