We wish to inform you that Sts. Peter and Paul has received a generous donation from the estate of Joseph Stanton Scott, Sr. In his instructions, Mr. Scott specified that his gift be used to make Sts. Peter and Paul "debt-free." We are pleased to share that, as a result, the remaining balance of \$2.76 million for the mortgage on our Emmaus Crossroads Center (Amana Street building) is no longer our responsibility.

This achievement would not be possible without Mr. Scott's thoughtful contribution, and we deeply appreciate his generosity.

Father Khanh Pham-Nguyen was aware of this gift before he left for his pilgrimage, and I know that he joins me in expressing gratitude for this remarkable act of kindness and goodwill that will help Sts. Peter and Paul for years to come.

We also want to extend a heartfelt mahalo to all of you – our parishioners and donors – whose generous donations to the campaign contributed directly to paying down the mortgages on both the Diocese and First Hawaiian Bank loans. As we celebrate this achievement, we also want to remind everyone that our parish continues to face ongoing expenses related to the upkeep and maintenance of the building.
