

Sacred Conversations

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It sounds so simple when St Paul says it: I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need. True, most of us lived much more simply when we were younger. Most of us have adapted to roomier houses and better air conditioning, maybe even marveling at how many of us, in our childhood, lived in one house with just one bathroom.

In fact, I'm amazed at how well today's first-year college students adapt to their tiny dorm rooms, especially after growing up with a room of their own, a stocked 'frig, and their own car. What makes the relative austerity of dorm life fun, of course, is the proximity to friends at all hours, and being on one's own for the first time.

But could you do it again? St. Paul says he could. He says that he's comfortable in all circumstances, whether he's hot or cold, hungry or full, in a cozy room or out on the street. What makes it bearable (maybe even fun?) for him is to watch God's grace at work in all circumstances.

This is the "secret" that he's learned. It's that powerful verse that is the favorite scripture text for so many: I can do all things in Christ who strengthens me (Philippians 4:13). Have you memorized this, put it on your mirror, made a bumper sticker out of it? If you haven't made this verse your own yet, try it on and see if it fits. (It won't come around in the readings for another three years, so today's the day to set this scripture in your heart.)

What particular challenge is Christ strengthening in you right now?

Se oye tan simple cuando lo dice San Pablo: He aprendido el secreto de comer bien y de tener hambre, de vivir en abundancia y en necesidad. Cierto. Es verdad que muchos de nosotros vivíamos con mucha más simplicidad cuando éramos jóvenes. Casi todos hemos elegido tener casas más grandes y mejores aires acondicionados, y tal vez muchos de nosotros hasta nos asombramos de recordar que vivíamos en una casas que tenía un solo baño.

De hecho, me sorprende que tan bien se adaptan los estudiantes de primer año de universidad a sus diminutos dormitorios, especialmente después de haber crecido con una recamara propia, una nevera repleta y su propio auto. Lo que hace que la austeridad de un dormitorio universitario sea divertido, por supuesto, es la proximidad de los amigos a todas horas, y también vivir solos por primera vez.

Pero ¿podrías hacerlo de nuevo? San Pablo dice que él sí. Él dice que él puede estar cómodo en todo tipo de circunstancias, aunque tenga frio o calor, hambre o con panza llena, viva en un cuarto calentito o en la calle. Lo que le permite soportar (y hasta encontrarlo divertido) es ver la gracia de Dios en acción en todo tipo de circunstancias.

Este es el "secreto" que él ha descubierto. Es ese versículo poderoso que es el favorito de muchos: "Todo lo puedo en Cristo que me sostiene (Filipenses 4:13). ¿Te lo has memorizado, lo has puesto en tu espejo, lo has convertido en calcomanía para tu auto? Si no has hecho tuyo este versículo, inténtalo y ve si te queda. (No se va a repetir en las lecturas por otros tres años, así que hoy es el día de grabar esta escritura en tu corazón.)

¿Qué reto en particular está Cristo fortaleciendo dentro de ti en este momento?

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

Matthew 22:1-14 or 22:1-10

Jesus' parable of the wedding feast ends in a startling way. How do you know if you are properly dressed for the wedding feast (the return of Christ)?

Isaiah 25:6-10a

Seven hundred years before the birth of Christ, the prophet Isaiah foreshadows the messianic age to come with lush imagery. What does this imagery reveal to you about God's nature?

Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20

Paul informs the Philippians he has learned the secret of living well under any circumstance: find strength in Christ. *How is this true in your life?*

LIVE THE LITURGY

Pope Francis constantly reminds us of the wideness of God's mercy and its unconditional character. God is always patiently loving his children and opening the doors to his heart. We must, however, freely choose to accept God's invitation and join in the feast of his love. We desire many things and we have restless hearts.
