Seventh Sunday of Easter

We went to the most beautiful concert the other day. I'm still meditating on the many ways it touched and expanded my heart. It began with two songs sung beautifully by a "traditional" choir. Then a larger choir stepped up and joined them, and WOW. The sound and richness of their voices seemed to multiply ten times the sound of the original choir. Applause. They disappear, and the sanctuary fills with the sublime colors of the Korean Choir, a combination of choirs from the Korean churches in the area. Oh, how this choir watches the director. Every note is perfect, every movement choreographed meticulously.

Applause. The colors swirl away, and now the church fills with the delightful dancers from India. The drums gently beat as these gorgeous dancers get everyone up on their feet and we all pretend we're in the closing dance sequence of some charming movie from "Bollywood."

Applause. Ha! Here come the Jews. All it takes is a clarinet, violin, two singers playing some kind of fascinating but unidentifiable string instruments, and we are transported to a pre-Holocaust Eastern European shtetl. The sound is haunting, dissonant, challenging, utterly stunning. I release my heart once again. The Jews own it.

And so it goes. One choir after the other commands the room, and then they all come together for the last piece, "Make the circle wider." I notice, for the first time, that there are four Caucasians mixed in with the Mexicans, and three African-Americans dancing with the Indians. And the words of today's gospel seem to sound all through the church, the city, the world: Father, may they all be one.

And they were. And we are.

Séptimo Domingo de Pascua

El otro día fuimos a un concierto tan hermoso. Todavía estoy meditando las tantas maneras en las que me conmovió y expandió mi corazón. Comenzó con dos canciones cantadas bellísimamente por un coro "tradicional." Después entró en escena otro coro mucho más grande que se les unió, y GUAU. El sonido y la calidad de sus voces multiplicaron diez veces el sonido del coro original.

Aplausos. Desaparecen, y el santuario se llena con los colores sublimes del coro coreano, una combinación de todos los coros de las iglesias coreanas del área. Ah, y cómo obedece a su director este coro. Cada nota es perfecta, cada momento está meticulosamente coreografiado.

Aplausos. Los colores dan vueltas y desaparecen, y ahora la iglesia se llena con los encantadores bailarines de la India. Los tambores suenan suavemente mientras estos hermosos bailarines nos hacen poner a todos de pie para que pretendamos que estamos en el baile de cierre de alguna encantadora película de "Bollywood."

Aplausos. ¡Ja! Aquí vienen los judíos. Sólo necesitan un clarinete, un violín, y dos cantantes que tocan una especie de instrumento de cuerdas fascinante pero que no pude identificar, y fuimos transportados a un pueblecito de Europa del Este antes del Holocausto. El sonido es evocador, disonante, desafiante, totalmente despampanante. Una vez más suelto mi corazón. Ahora le pertenece a los judíos.

Y así continua. Un coro después del otro toma posesión del lugar, y por último todos se unen para la pieza final, "Hagamos el círculo más grande." Me fijo por primera vez que hay cuatro personas de raza blanca mezclados con los mexicanos, y los tres afro-americanos que bailan con las personas de la India. Y es como si las palabras del evangelio resonaran por toda la iglesia, la ciudad, el mundo: Padre, que todos sean uno solo. Y lo fueron. Y lo somos.

Gospel Reading

Jesus' final words in his farewell discourse are a prayer for all future believers. Jesus speaks of us as a "gift" to him from the Father. What do you find most compelling about this idea?

GOSPEL

"So that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me." Does technology bring us together, or does it remind us of distance and differences and keep us apart? Most days, I'm not so sure. With the constant inundation of news from across the world, it can be easier to tune out the sufferings and the joys of people we'll never meet, in places we'll never visit. But is this the invitation of Jesus?

Over the centuries, our Church has become truly universal across the globe. There are Christians across nations and cultures, across lines of rich and poor. There are Christians who live behind white picket fences, and Christians dying in conflict zones. "That they may all be one," Jesus prays. One in what? Love. "That the love with which you loved me may be in them." This is easier said than done, of course. The world is far too vast for us to individually love every human being. I can hardly remember the names of half the regulars at my Sunday Mass! But that doesn't mean we can't try. "I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word." Jesus had this religious popular explosion in mind. The mission and message of Christ was not meant to stop in the Apostle's generation or stay cordoned off in the geographic confines of Israel. Jesus' words at the Last Supper are a prayer, a plea to the Father for the spread and unity of the Church across time and space. This week, look up organizations supporting the persecuted Church and make a donation. Next week, visit a struggling parish within your own diocese. When you meet someone new at hospitality Sunday, invite them over for dinner to get to know them better. Whether far off or close to home, let's allow Jesus' prayer to live in us, to be drawn together in love.
